

Re: Requesting a 6-month extension for Tehama County to accept the SB1022 award

Dear Mr. Scott;

Tehama County was informed this week of ongoing efforts to transfer unused AB900 Phase I funds to the SB1022 program. Therefore, we are asking for a 6-month extension, until March of 2015, to accept the recommended SB1022 award.

Tehama County sincerely thanks the SB1022 Executive Steering Committee and the Board of State and Community Corrections for the conditional award of \$6,526,000 for the Tehama County Community Corrections Re-entry and Day Reporting Center and for approving our time extension request for accepting the funding. Unfortunately, the award amount is less than one-third (1/3) of the proposed project costs. The partial award amount is not sufficient to develop a project that meets the essential goals of the originally proposed project and the County continues to seek additional funding.

The County is committed to the original project concept and is therefore proceeding with the CEQA process for the original project scope and moving forward with the relocation of the existing library on the site to be able to move forward immediately if additional SB1022 funding is made available or to meet all project readiness criteria in the upcoming SB863 competitive funding cycle.

On July 29, 2014 a Resolution rejecting the conditional award was submitted to you. The attached Resolution rescinds that rejection with the hope that additional funds will be transferred into the SB1022 program.

We ask that this modified request be forwarded to the BSCC Board of Directors for consideration at their meeting scheduled for September 11, 2014. Tehama County staff will be available to attend the meeting to respond to questions if necessary.

## RESOLUTION NO. 2014-84

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS RESCINDING THE REJECTION OF THE AWARD OF FUNDING THROUGH THE SB1022 ADULT LOCAL CRIMINAL JUSTICE FACILITIES CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, Tehama County adopted a Local Adult Detention Facility Needs Assessment Study on October 22, 2013, and

WHEREAS, the Tehama County Local Adult Detention Facility Needs Assessment Study identified the need for a \$22 million Community Correction Re-Entry and Day Reporting Center.

WHEREAS, the Executive Steering Committee of the Board of State and Community Corrections administered the competitive SB1022 Adult Local Criminal Justice Facilities Construction grant program with a maximum award of \$20 million for small county projects, and

WHEREAS, the Executive Steering Committee recommended a partial award of \$6,526,000 to the County of Tehama due to limited SB1022 funds availability.

WHEREAS, the County of Tehama has determined that the partial award is not sufficient to develop a project that meets the goals of the identified project in the jail needs assessment, and

WHEREAS, on July 29, 2014 the Board of Supervisors, by Resolution 2014-74, did reject the award of the partial funding through the SB1022 Adult Local Criminal Justice Facilities Construction Program.

WHEREAS, the County of Tehama has since been notified of efforts by the Board of State and Community Corrections to transfer AB900 Phase I jail construction funds, recently declined by Amador County, to the SB1022 program.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Supervisors does hereby rescind the rejection of the partial SB1022 funding award.
