SUBJECT: Senate Bill 1022 (Adult Local Criminal Justice Facilities Construction Program): Santa Barbara County Relinquishment and Recommended Conditional Awards to Tulare and San Joaquin Counties: **Requesting Approval.**

Summary

Santa Barbara County has formally relinquished its Senate Bill (SB) 1022 Adult Local Criminal Justice Facilities Construction Financing Program funding award of \$38,976,000. This agenda item requests that the Board of State and Community Corrections acknowledge and accept this relinquishment and approve the allocation of funding to the next-ranked projects on the list. This means that Tulare County would receive \$6,648,000 to augment to a full \$40,000,000 award the partial award of \$33,352,000 it received on January 16, 2014 (Attachment E-1). San Joaquin County, which was not funded and had requested \$40,000,000, would receive the remaining \$32,328,000.

Background

The currently authorized SB 1022 lease revenue bond funding authority is \$500,000,000. The Board fully allocated this funding at its January 16, 2014 meeting by making conditional awards to 14 counties.

At that meeting the Board made a full award of \$38,976,000 to Santa Barbara County, which ranked third in the medium-sized county category. In the same category the Board granted Tulare County, which ranked fifth, a conditional partial award of \$33,352,000 of the \$40,000,000 it had requested (Attachment E-1).

On January 22, 2016 the County of Santa Barbara provided formal notice declining the conditional award (Attachment E-2).

Tulare County is the next in rank order for full funding in the Medium County Set-aside category. San Joaquin County is next (sixth on the list). It has been past practice of this Board since the AB 900 programs to allow funds reverted by a county to be awarded to the next county in ranked order within the same population category.

Recommendation/Action Needed

1. Staff recommends the Board acknowledge that Santa Barbara County has declined its SB 1022 Adult Local Criminal Justice Facilities Construction Financing Program funding award.
2. Staff recommends that the Board make Tulare County's partial award a full conditional award, increasing it from \$33,352,000 to \$40,000,000, and that San Joaquin County

receive a partial conditional award of \$32,328,000. Staff also requests approval to formally present these two conditional awards to Tulare and San Joaquin counties.
