**SUBJECT:** Senate Bill 863 (Adult Local Criminal Justice Facilities Construction Program): Placer County Scope Change for Partial Conditional Award: **Requesting Approval.**

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### Summary

The BSCC has conditionally awarded Placer County \$9,500,000 in Senate Bill (SB) 863 Adult Local Criminal Justice Facilities Construction Financing Program funding, which represents a partial award of the \$40 million the county originally had requested. This report asks the Board to approve a scope change requested by the county that would reduce the size and cost of its original jail construction proposal.

### Background

On June 20, 2014, Senate Bill 863 (Chapter 37, Statutes of 2014 (SB 863) became law, authorizing up to \$500,000,000 in state lease-revenue bond financing for the acquisition, design and construction of Adult Local Criminal Justice Facilities (ALCJF).

The Board fully allocated this funding at its November 12, 2015 meeting by making conditional awards to 15 counties, Placer County received a partial award (Attachment I-1).

On January 14, 2016 the BSCC received a letter from the Captain Don Hutchinson of the Placer County Sheriff's office advising the county is in a contract to prepare the scope reduction project. (Attachment I-2). The proposed scope reduction will include a 45-bed, two-tier Mental Health Unit for acute and chronic mental health inmates housed at the South Placer, Roseville Campus. The Placer County scope reduction is consistent with its original SB 863 proposal. The county will be building a portion of the original proposed SB863 project.

### Recommendation/Action Needed or Information

Approve Placer County's scope reduction for the SB 863 partial conditional award.
