- [AB 988](#) (Stone, Mark D) Outdoor Environmental Education and Recreation Grants Program.**
Status: 8/28/2015-Failed Deadline pursuant to Rule 61(a)(11). (Last location was APPR. on 8/27/2015)
Location: 8/28/2015-S. 2 YEAR
Summary: Would require the Department of Parks and Recreation to establish, on or before March 30, 2016, an Outdoor Environmental Education and Recreation Grants Program with the purpose of increasing the ability of underserved and at-risk populations to participate in outdoor recreation and educational experiences by awarding grants to public organizations, nonprofit organizations, or both. The bill would require the director to develop criteria, procedures, and accountability measures as may be necessary to implement the program and to administer the program to ensure that priority is given to underserved populations, as specified.
- [AB 1014](#) (Thurmond D) Pupils: truancy: Our Children's Success-The Early Intervention Attendance Pilot Grant Program.**
Status: 9/11/2015-Ordered to inactive file at the request of Senator Leyva.
Location: 9/11/2015-S. INACTIVE FILE
Summary: Would make various findings and declarations regarding truancy. The bill would establish the Our Children's Success-The Early Intervention Attendance Pilot Grant Program under the administration of the State Department of Education. The program would provide grants to applicant public schools, school districts, and county offices of education seeking to resolve the attendance problems of pupils in kindergarten and grades 1 to 3, inclusive. This bill contains other related provisions.
- [AB 1699](#) (Kim R) Homeless youth emergency service projects.**
Status: 2/18/2016-Referred to Com. on HUM. S.
Location: 2/18/2016-A. HUM. S.

Summary: Would require a homeless youth emergency service project to be established in the County of Orange, and would authorize the Office of Emergency Services to establish additional projects in other counties, with a priority given to underserved counties. The bill would additionally require each project to provide transitional living services, for a period of up to 36 months, with access to education and employment assistance, independent living skill development, and family engagement and interventions. The bill would appropriate \$25,000,000 from the General Fund to the Office of Emergency Services to provide additional funding for these homeless youth emergency service projects.
- [AB 1708](#) (Gonzalez D) Criminal actions: venue.**
Status: 1/26/2016-From printer. May be heard in committee February 25.
Location: 1/25/2016-A. PRINT
Summary: Current law governs venue in criminal actions. If more than one violation of any of specified criminal offenses occurs in more than one jurisdictional territory, the jurisdiction of any one of those offenses, and of any offenses properly joinable with that offense, shall be in any jurisdiction where at least one of the offenses occurred, as specified. This bill would make technical, nonsubstantive changes to those provisions.
- [AB 1730](#) (Atkins D) Human trafficking: minors.**
Status: 3/1/2016-From committee: Do pass and re-refer to Com. on APPR. with recommendation: To Consent Calendar. (Ayes 7. Noes 0.) (March 1). Re-referred to Com. on APPR.
Location: 3/1/2016-A. APPR.
Summary: Would authorize the chief probation officer of a county to create a program to provide services to youth within his or her jurisdiction that address the need for services relating to the commercial sexual exploitation of youth. The bill would provide that funding for these purposes shall be contingent upon an appropriation in the annual Budget Act. The bill would provide that funds appropriated for these purposes shall be administered by the Board of State and Community Corrections. This bill contains other existing laws.
- [AB 1731](#) (Atkins D) Human trafficking: Statewide Interagency Human Trafficking Task Force.**
Status: 3/1/2016-From committee: Do pass and re-refer to Com. on APPR. with recommendation: To Consent Calendar. (Ayes 7. Noes 0.) (March 1). Re-referred to Com. on APPR.
Location: 3/1/2016-A. APPR.
Summary: Would create the Statewide Interagency Human Trafficking Task Force, as provided, and would require the task force to gather statewide data on sex and labor traffickers, sex buyers, and human trafficking victims, to recommend interagency protocols and best practices for training and outreach to law enforcement, victim service providers, and other state and private sector employees likely to encounter sex trafficking, and to evaluate and implement approaches to increase public

awareness about human trafficking.

[AB 2212](#) (Harper R) Pupils: suspensions and expulsions: electronic acts.

Status: 3/3/2016-Referred to Com. on ED.

Location: 3/3/2016-A. ED.

Summary: Current law prohibits the suspension, or recommendation for expulsion, of a pupil from school unless the superintendent of the school district or the principal of the school determines that the pupil has committed any of various specified acts, including, but not limited to, engaging in an act of bullying by means of an electronic act. This bill would expressly include a video, including, but not limited to, a video or image of two or more pupils fighting that is posted to the Internet, within the definition of what constitutes an electronic act.

[AB 2285](#) (McCarty D) State employment: former foster youth.

Status: 3/3/2016-Referred to Com. on P.E., R., & S.S.

Location: 3/3/2016-A. P.E.,R. & S.S.

Summary: Would, until January 1, 2021, require the Department of Human Resources to establish a class in the classification plan that would enable former foster youth who do not otherwise meet the eligibility criteria for any current class to obtain employment with the state. The bill would, until January 1, 2021, also require the department to establish 100 positions within this class and allocate them to an appointing power based upon the appropriate match between the responsibilities of the position and the responsibilities of the appointing power.

[AB 2306](#) (Frazier D) High school graduation requirements: pupils transferring from juvenile court schools.

Status: 3/3/2016-Referred to Com. on ED.

Location: 3/3/2016-A. ED.

Summary: Would require a school district to exempt a pupil who, any time after the pupil completes 10th grade, transfers to the school district from a juvenile court school from all coursework and other requirements adopted by the governing board of the school district for high school graduation that are in addition to the statewide coursework requirements, unless the school district makes a finding that the pupil is reasonably able to complete the additional requirements in time to graduate from high school.

[AB 2695](#) (Obernalte R) Juvenile proceedings: competency.

Status: 2/22/2016-Read first time.

Location: 2/19/2016-A. PRINT

Summary: Current law requires proceedings to be suspended if the court finds substantial evidence raises a doubt as to a minor's competency. Current law requires the court to appoint an expert, as specified, to evaluate whether the minor suffers from a mental disorder, developmental disability, developmental immaturity, or other condition and, if so, whether the condition or conditions impair the minor's competency. This bill would revise and recast these provisions to, among other things, expand upon the duties imposed upon the expert during his or her evaluation of a minor whose competency is in doubt, as specified.

[AB 2719](#) (Garcia, Eduardo D) Workforce development: out of school youth.

Status: 2/22/2016-Read first time.

Location: 2/19/2016-A. PRINT

Summary: The California Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014 defines an individual with employment barriers to include youths who are individuals with disabilities, homeless youths, and youth who are in, or who have aged out of, the foster care system. This bill would include within the definition of an individual with employment barriers an out of school youth, as defined, would revise the duties of the California Workforce Development Board regarding out of school youth, as specified, and would define local workforce development system stakeholders, as specified.

[ACR 120](#) (Stone, Mark D) Data trusts: at-risk children.

Status: 2/4/2016-Referred to Com. on P. & C.P.

Location: 2/4/2016-A. P. & C.P.

Summary: This measure would recognize that the Legislature supports the development of safe and secure data sharing between public education, social service, and research entities through the Silicon Valley Regional Data Trust as it pertains specifically to at-risk, foster, homeless, and justice-involved children and youth and their families, in order to better serve, protect, and improve the futures of these Californians.

[SB 124](#) (Leno D) Juveniles: solitary confinement.

Status: 8/28/2015-Failed Deadline pursuant to Rule 61(a)(11). (Last location was APPR. on 8/27/2015)

Location: 8/28/2015-A. 2 YEAR

Summary: Would prohibit a person confined in a juvenile facility who is an imminent danger to himself, herself, or others as a result of a mental disorder, or who is gravely disabled, from being subject to solitary confinement. The bill would also prohibit a person, other than a person described above, who

is detained in any secure state or local juvenile facility from being subject to solitary confinement unless certain conditions are satisfied, including that the person poses an immediate and substantial risk of harm to the security of the facility, to himself or herself, or to others that is not the result of a mental disorder. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.
