Summary:

This agenda item requests approval of grant awards for the Residential Substance Abuse Treatment for State Prisoners (RSAT) Program as recommended by the Executive Steering Committee (ESC). A total of \$741,710 in federal RSAT funding is available. Adult detention facilities are allowed to request up to a maximum of \$185,427 for the first twelve months of the project period. A non-competitive Request for Application for continuation funding will be issued for a second year, contingent on the availability of federal funding.

Background:

At the November 8, 2012 meeting, the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) authorized staff to assemble an ESC to oversee the development of a Request for Proposal (RFP) using \$724,741 in RSAT Program funds to support local detention facilities in providing in-custody treatment services with an aftercare component requirement. Additionally, the Board appointed Board member, Dean Growdon, as Chair of the ESC. Four other subject matter experts also participated on this ESC which met in February to discuss project development, eligibility, funding amounts, and rating criteria. At the March BSCC meeting, the board authorized the Chair of the RSAT ESC to approve the RFP upon its completion, and release it to the field. The RFP was sent to County Sheriffs, Inmate Program Administrators, and was placed on the Department of General Services Grants Registry, as well as on the BSCC website. In May, the BSCC staff received five proposals in response to the RFP. These proposals were subsequently rated by the ESC and their funding recommendations are provided in the list of grant awards before you today for your approval (Attachment A).

Recommended Action Needed:

Staff is recommending the BSCC approve the recommended list of grant awards for the RSAT Program as identified in Attachment A.
