

Plans Toward Meeting
its Mandates

BSCC's Goals:

1. Collect, analyze, and report corrections data in a manner that meets mandates and informs effective policy and practice at the state and local level.
2. Support the implementation of best practices and policies to produce better outcomes for the criminal justice system and provide comprehensive training and technical assistance.
3. Promote the effective utilization of local corrections facilities and quality alternatives to incarceration to maximize public safety and resource efficiency.
4. Serve as a primary information source on managing criminal and juvenile populations.



GOAL ONE: Collect, analyze, and report corrections data in a manner that meets mandates and informs effective policy and practice at the state and local level

- ❖ Early efforts focused on meeting mandates
 - Baseline data
 - Realignment population data
 - Implementation of CCP Plans
- ❖ Current efforts
 - Integration of data
- ❖ Future efforts
 - Identify long term research questions
 - Design data collection efforts around those questions
 - Make data and research available on BSCC Web site



GOAL ONE: Collect, analyze, and report corrections data in a manner that meets mandates and informs effective policy and practice at the state and local level

I. Local Adult Detention Facility Report

- Provides data on PRCS, 1170(h) and parole violators
- Report to be published by end of March
- Workgroup meets in April to review and revise instrument
- Future reports to include integration of data from CPOC, AOC and CCP reports



GOAL ONE: Collect, analyze, and report corrections data in a manner that meets mandates and informs effective policy and practice at the state and local level

II. First Phase Baseline and Ongoing Realignment –Related Data Collection Instruments

- Includes data currently being collected by:
 - CPOC – probation data related to PRCS and 1170(h)
 - BSCC – jail data related to PRCS, 1170(h) and parole violators
 - AOC – dispositions of felonies at sentencing and probation revocations
- Data currently being reported separately
- Future efforts will integrate baseline and information from CCP report
- Additional data may be added after long term research questions are developed

III. CCP Realignment Implementation Plans

- For 2011, 58 plans received, for 2012, 30 responses received, including 15 revised plans
- Currently analyzing plans and clarifying information
- Report to include information on:
 - County's use of realignment funds
 - Outcome measures
 - Data collection process
 - Findings to date
 - Future planning efforts
 - Use of risk and needs assessments
 - Training and technical assistance needs



GOAL ONE: Collect, analyze, and report corrections data in a manner that meets mandates and informs effective policy and practice at the state and local level

IV. Data Dashboards and Information Sharing

- Local Adult Detention Facility report and data will be posted to BSCC Web site when published
- AOC data will be posted after September, 2013
- Designing data dashboards to display information that BSCC currently collects and to be expanded to include baseline data
- Will develop a catalog of research activities and reports and findings

VI. Data and Research Standing Committee

- Formed in January
- Chaired by Susan Mauriello
- Will be responsible for working with staff on identifying data collection plan and long term research questions

VII. Research Staff

- 5 new positions (Research Specialist V, Research Specialist II, two Research Program Specialist I, one Research Analyst)
- Currently establishing positions and recruiting for Research Specialist V



GOAL TWO: Support the implementation of best practices and policies to produce better outcomes for the criminal justice system and provide comprehensive training and technical assistance

❖ Current efforts

- Examining CCP plans to develop county specific technical assistance plans
- Integrating the CalEMA grant programs
- Establishing policy committees
- Reviewing training needs
- Making national best practice information available on Web site

❖ Future efforts

- Hosting symposiums on best practices
- Making state and county best practice information available on Web site
- Aligning grant funding with evidence-based principles

III. Technical Assistance Plans

- FRs will continue to provide technical assistance
- County specific TA plans by July 2013

IV. Transferred Grant Programs

- **California Gang Reduction, Intervention, and Prevention (CalGRIP) Program**
 - 2012-2013 funding of 20 projects
 - ESC to develop RFP for 2013-14 funding
- **Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG)**
 - Completed RFA process for 4 programs and contract process for 74 projects - RFA process underway for 1 program
 - 2013-2017 four year strategic plan and funding priorities for JAG will be developed by BSCC after input from stakeholders
- **Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) for State Prisoners**
 - An ESC is currently developing RFP for April release



GOAL TWO: Support the implementation of best practices and policies to produce better outcomes for the criminal justice system and provide comprehensive training and technical assistance

V. Gang Issues Standing Committee

- Formed to address BSCC's new responsibility to address gangs
- Chaired by David Maggard
- Committee will meet quarterly beginning in April

VI. Juvenile Justice Standing Committee

- Formed to develop policy recommendations on California's juvenile justice system
- Chaired by David Steinhart
- Committee will meet at least quarterly beginning April 10th



GOAL TWO: Support the implementation of best practices and policies to produce better outcomes for the criminal justice system and provide comprehensive training and technical assistance

VII. Standards and Training

- Expanded training delivered by staff on best practices in training
- Formed ESC to examine how STC program can best meet local needs
- Conducting job analysis to identify how entry level job has changed due to realignment as foundation for updating training standards
- Will coordinate regional and statewide training opportunities on emerging topics with shared interest



GOAL TWO: Support the implementation of best practices and policies to produce better outcomes for the criminal justice system and provide comprehensive training and technical assistance

VIII. Best Practices

- BSCC has added national best practices resources on Web site
- Future activities include:
 - Cataloging and sharing best practices in California
 - Hosting symposiums and trainings on best practice
 - Providing technical assistance and training on implementation science and program fidelity
 - Including county programs in BSCC's online best practices library



GOAL THREE: Promote the effective utilization of local corrections facilities and quality alternatives to incarceration to maximize public safety and resource efficiency

❖ Current efforts

- Developing RFP for SB 1022 funding
- Identification of emerging needs

❖ Future efforts

- Release of SB 1022 funding in October
- Symposiums and training to highlight innovative and best practices in population management
- Revising regulations to address emerging facility needs



GOAL THREE: Promote the effective utilization of local corrections facilities and quality alternatives to incarceration to maximize public safety and resource efficiency

- I. SB 81/AB 1628 Local Youthful Offender Rehabilitative Construction Program
 - Awarded \$232 million to 14 counties for construction or rehabilitation of juvenile facilities
- II. AB 900 Public Safety and Offender Rehabilitation Services Act of 2007
 - Awarded \$1.2 billion to 21 counties for the construction and renovation of local jail projects
- III. SB 1022 Financing of Adult Local Criminal Justice Facility Construction
 - An ESC will convene on March 18th to develop RFP
 - RFP will encourage counties to construct inmate program and treatment space
 - RFP will be released in May
 - Awards will be made in October



GOAL THREE: Promote the effective utilization of local corrections facilities and quality alternatives to incarceration to maximize public safety and resource efficiency

IV. Inspections, Technical Assistance, and Regulation Revision

- The BSCC conducts inspections of facilities to ensure compliance
- Using that forum to identify emerging needs associated with realignment
- Regulations to be revised as needed



GOAL FOUR: Serve as a primary information source on managing criminal and juvenile populations

❖ Completed

- Provided information and resources on nationally recognized best practices on BSCC Web site.

❖ In Progress

- Building its capacity as an informational hub on effective corrections practices at the state and local level
- Developing a dynamic Web site of current information, resources, studies, and data on California's corrections system
- Nurturing collaborative relationships with state and local correctional agencies and professional organizations
- Developing data dashboards

❖ Future Activities

- Provide collaborative solutions to system challenges
- Host Webinars; post curriculum, videos, and other information online; and conduct regional and statewide training sessions.
