

Out of Compliance Departments

Six agencies did not qualify for a Substantial Compliance recommendation and were found Out of Compliance. They are listed below and a summary of the compliance issues for each department is included.

Glendora Police Department – First Year Out of Compliance

6 eligible corrections staff declared in the Annual Training Plan
144 minimum required hours declared in the Annual Training Plan
1 staff failed to meet annual training requirement (short 8 hours)

Kern County Sheriff's Office – First Year Out of Compliance

444 eligible corrections staff declared in the Annual Training Plan
12,616 minimum required hours declared in the Annual Training Plan
2 staff failed to meet core training requirement (did not complete within one year)

Modoc County Sheriff's Office – First Year Out of Compliance

9 eligible corrections staff declared in the Annual Training Plan
824 minimum required hours declared in the Annual Training Plan
1 staff failed to meet annual training requirement (short 24 hours)

Plumas County Probation Department – First Year Out of Compliance

8 eligible corrections staff declared in the Annual Training Plan
360 minimum required hours declared in the Annual Training Plan
1 staff failed to meet annual training requirement (short 11 hours)

San Mateo County Probation Department – First Year Out of Compliance

306 eligible corrections staff declared in the Annual Training Plan
