Grants would be awarded to assist counties with the creation or expansion of infrastructure to consistently collect and report criminal justice information. Effective January 1, 2017, counties would be required to report data to the BSCC and annually thereafter. The BSCC would be required to summarize the data and report it to the Governor and the Legislature on or before May 15, 2017 and annually thereafter.
