**Mentally III Offender Crime Reduction Grant
Program Close-out Summary**

Summary

This information item provides a summary of the Mentally III Offender Crime Reduction (MIOCR) Grant program administered by the Board of State and Community Corrections from 2015 to 2018. The attached report highlights the variety of interventions, the overall evaluation used by this agency, and results for both the adult and juvenile projects.

Background

The MIOCR Grant was developed to fund promising and evidence-based strategies for reducing recidivism in justice-involved individuals living with mental health disorders. The goal was to improve outcomes for these individuals through appropriate prevention, diversion, intervention and supervision services while protecting public safety.

Penal Code Section 6045 required the BSCC to award competitive grants to counties to implement locally developed, collaborative, and multi-disciplinary adult and juvenile projects. It required that half the funding be awarded to projects designed for adult offenders with a mental illness and half to projects aimed at juvenile offenders with mental health issues.

Twenty-one projects in 17 counties were awarded \$18.8 million and were required to provide, at a minimum, a 25 percent match of the total grant amount received.
