

CALIFORNIA BOARD OF STATE AND COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS 2024 FEDERAL YOUTH DETENTION REPORT

- When a youth is held in a secure juvenile detention facility solely for a federal detention hold (e.g., illegal entry)¹, administrators are required to report the name of that individual and their length of stay to the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC).
- > Please submit this form to the BSCC by the 10th of the month if any youth were held for the federal government and released during the preceding month. Submit the report after the youth has been released.
- A separate form must be completed for **each youth** detained **for the federal government**.
