<b>Goal</b>	Continue to apply screenings and appropriate level of service to substance use clients
Objective	100% of clients screened for appropriate level of care
Objective	Refer clients to Drug Court when appropriate
Outcome Measure	Documentation in case management
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Progress toward stated goal	All moderate and high-risk clients are referred to the substance use disorder team to be evaluated for an appropriate level of care. Clients are referred to the Drug Court team for program evaluation if appropriate.

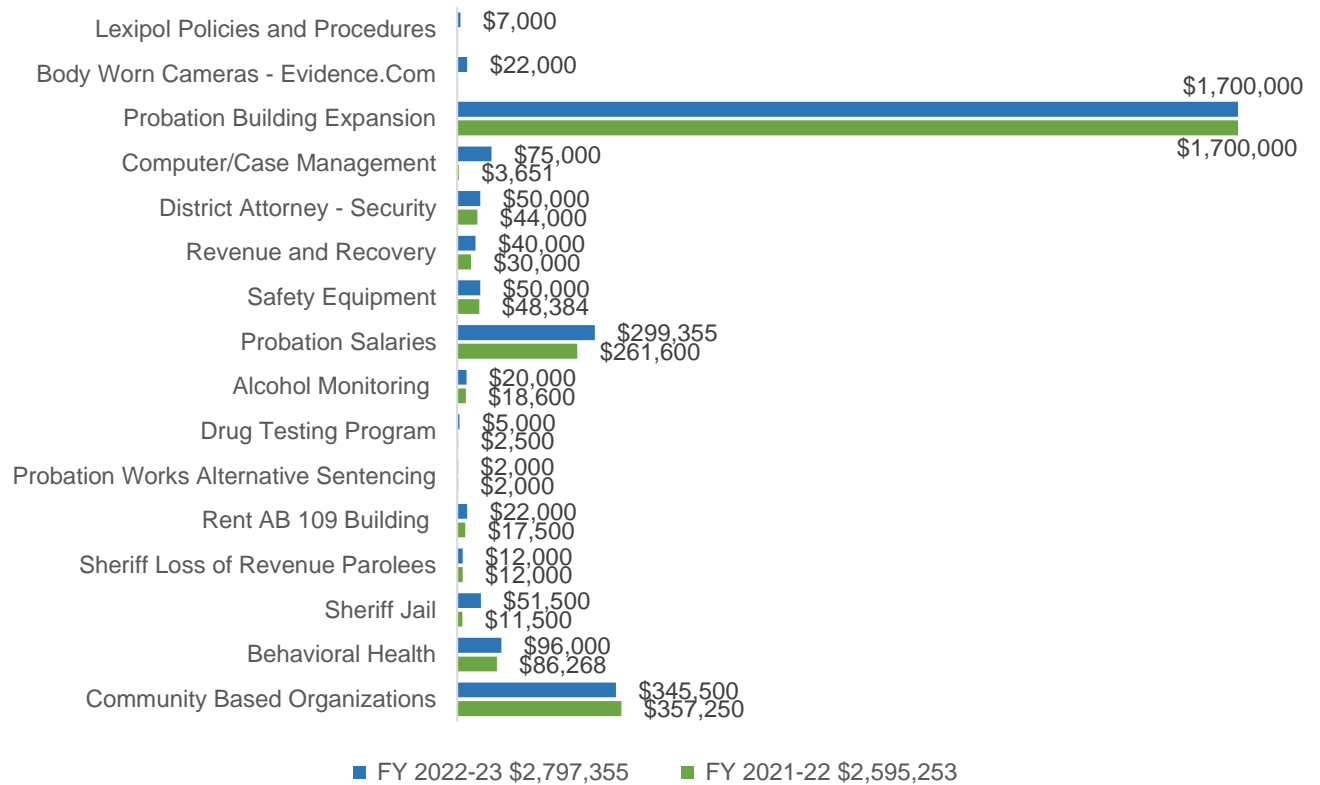
<b>Goal</b>	Continue to improve Behavioral Health Court model.
Objective	All probation officers are to receive trauma informed training
Objective	All clients are to be screened for behavioral health services at probation intake
Outcome Measure	Completion certificates and training records
Outcome Measure	Documentation and program reports in case management
Progress Toward Stated Goal	All probation officers supervising a caseload have or will receive certified trauma informed or equivalent training to be applied when developing a client case plan. A mental health assistant assists with behavioral health screening of clients during intake.

<b>Goal</b>	Provide cognitive based programming to jail inmates
Objective	Provide training to staff to be able to facilitate cognitive based programming
Objective	Create case plans for inmates and screen for appropriate jail programming
Objective	Provide inmates with tablets and program material for independent work in addition to in class work
Outcome Measure	Training certificates and training records
Outcome Measure	Review case file in the case management system
Progress Toward Stated Goal	All inmates have access to tablets to complete programming. Staff have received instructor training with advanced training scheduled for the next FY.

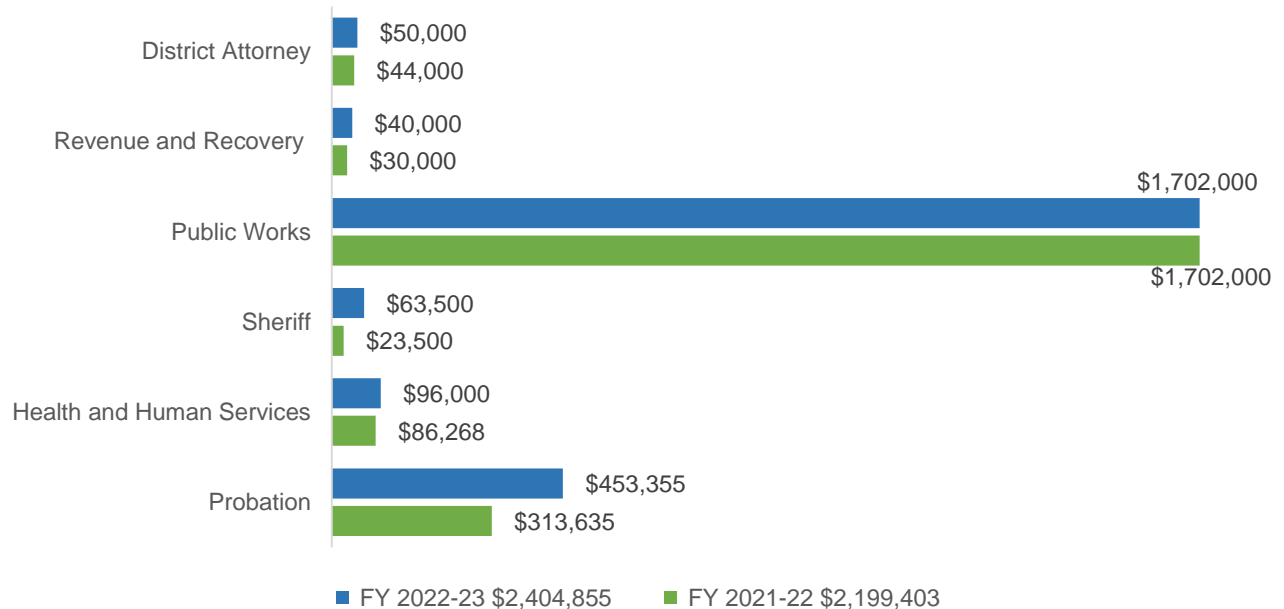

## FY 2021-2022 and FY 2022-23 Allocation Comparison

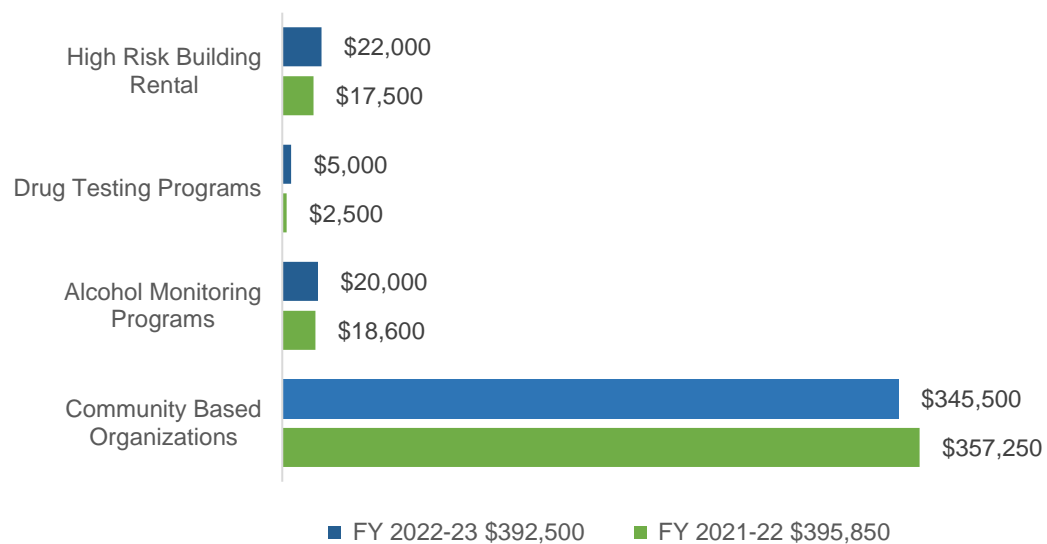
### FY 21-22 and 22-23 Allocations
