### FY 2021-22

<b>Goal</b>	Increase Educational Development and Workability Programming in the Day Reporting Center
Objective	Use of Behavioral Health Specialist to provide education and skill building classes at the DRC.
Objective	Use of Behavioral Health Specialist to provide increased educational assistance to incarcerated individuals, to include GED and high school diploma coursework.
Objective	Use of Behavioral Health Specialist to increase the connection to local community college for non-credited life skill classes.
Outcome Measure	Increase number of GED and HS Diploma recipients and number of offenders participating in educational services
Outcome Measure	Increase number of participants enrolling in classes at the local community college for skill building and/or certificate programs.
Outcome Measure	Increase number of offenders who gain skills necessary for becoming employable.
Progress toward stated goal	<p>Attention was directed towards job readiness, avocation and vocational classes. Specifically, culinary, woodworking, art, budgeting, soft skills, interview skills, resume building, and communication.</p> <p>Partnership was developed with Black Fox Timber Management to develop eligible participants to be trained and hired in the forestry tech industry.</p> <p>The number of probationers served by this goal was 61 with a total of 402 service hours provided.</p>

<b>Goal</b>	Ongoing Participation and Increased Collaboration in the Mental Health Diversion Court
Objective	Increase involvement from the Probation Department in the program
Objective	Through collaboration, a review of the standard operating procedures for the Mental Health Diversion Court
Objective	Continue to gather and maintain data to track outcomes
Outcome Measure	Attendance by Probation at Diversion meetings and Court attendances. Begin supervising MH Diversion Court participants
Outcome Measure	Collaboratively examine current procedures for the program. Modify or enhance as needed
Outcome Measure	Utilization of resources from BHS and Probation to track and evaluate data
Progress Toward Stated Goal	<p>One probation officer is dedicated to participating in Mental Health Diversion and has assumed supervision of a few participants as needed.</p> <p>Mental Health Collaborative meetings do take place quarterly, and procedures are discussed.</p> <p>Probation has only been able collect data on participants that the Probation Department are involved with. Unfortunately, there hasn't been collaboration with BHS to track and evaluate data.</p>

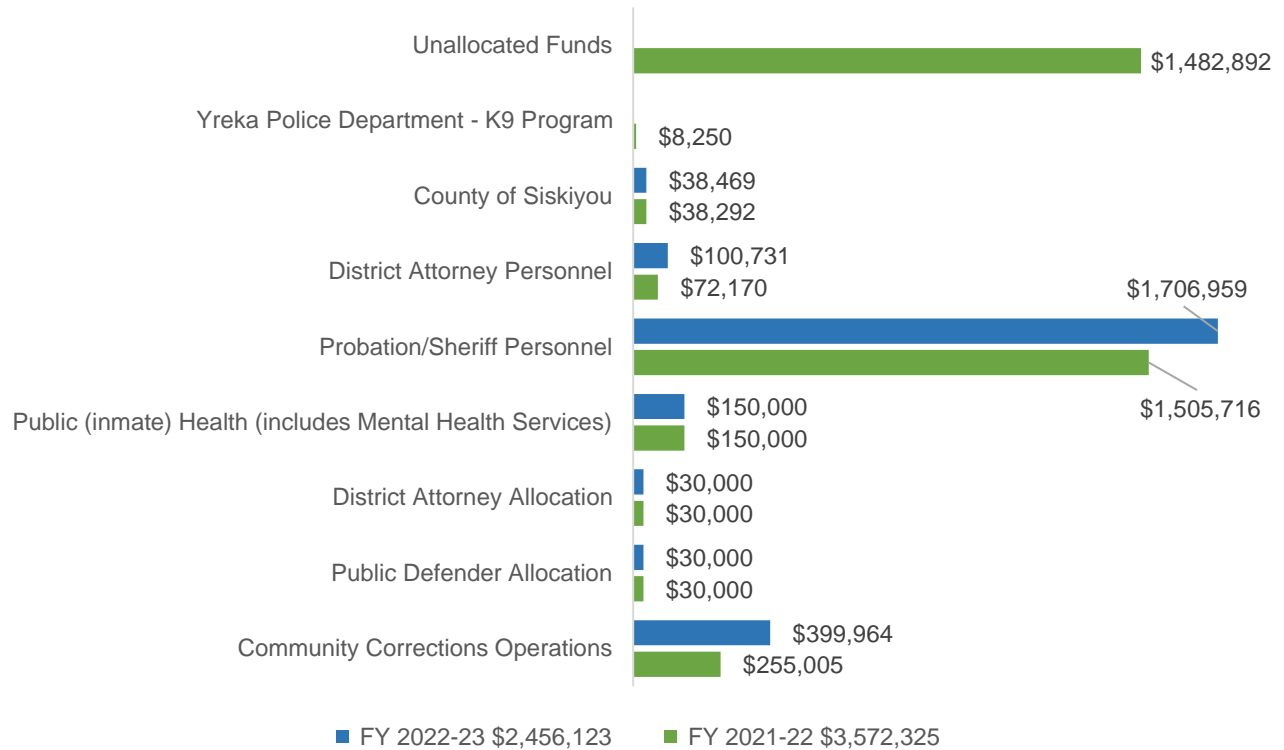
<b>Goal</b>	Continued Delivery and Enhancement of Services and Programming to Offenders

Objective	Develop Child Abusers and Parenting Program
Outcome Measure	Increase in CBT and evidence based programming provided by the contracted providers.

Progress toward stated goal	<p>Contracts with two providers are in existence, and a third is in process.</p> <p>The Probation Program Coordinator position has been created and is soon to be approved by the Board of Supervisors.</p> <p>Child Abusers and Parenting Program requirements have been reviewed, as well as other models that are in operational existence.</p>

Objective	Utilization of a social worker within the Public Defender's Office to support Mental Health Diversion participants
Objective	Utilization of a Behavioral Health Specialist in the Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA) to support Mental Health Diversion participants
Outcome Measure	Increased number of MHD assessments performed in the reporting year
Outcome Measure	Increase of successfully diverted MHD participants by increasing the linkage to resources and services by the Public Defender Social Worker.
Outcome Measure	Increase of successfully diverted MHD participants by increasing the support provided by the BHS Specialist
Progress Toward Stated Goal	<p>HHSA has secured a contract with the LPHA, and assessments have been directed to that resource.</p> <p>Social worker has been hired and will begin establishing a plan to support MHD participants to achieve successful diversion.</p> <p>The BHS Specialist has not been hired, but the hiring process has commenced.</p>

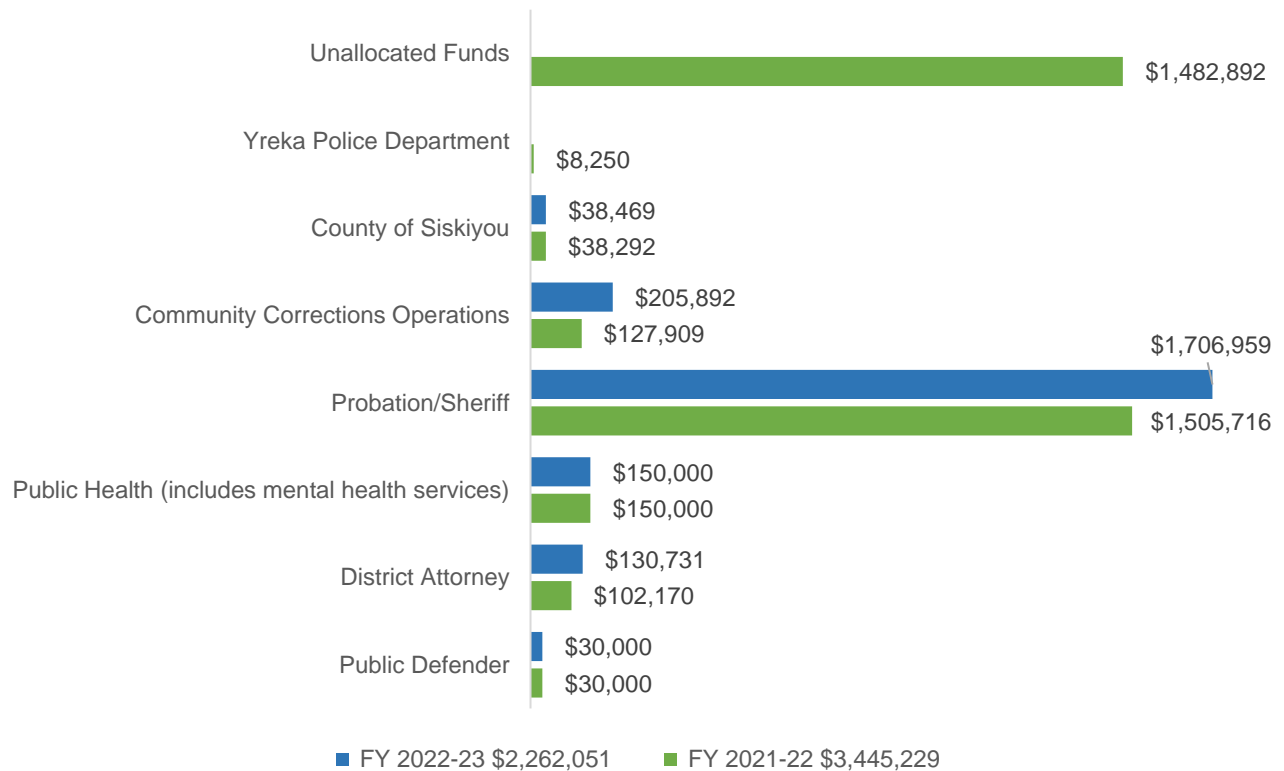

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## FY 2021-2022 and FY 2022-23 Allocation Comparison

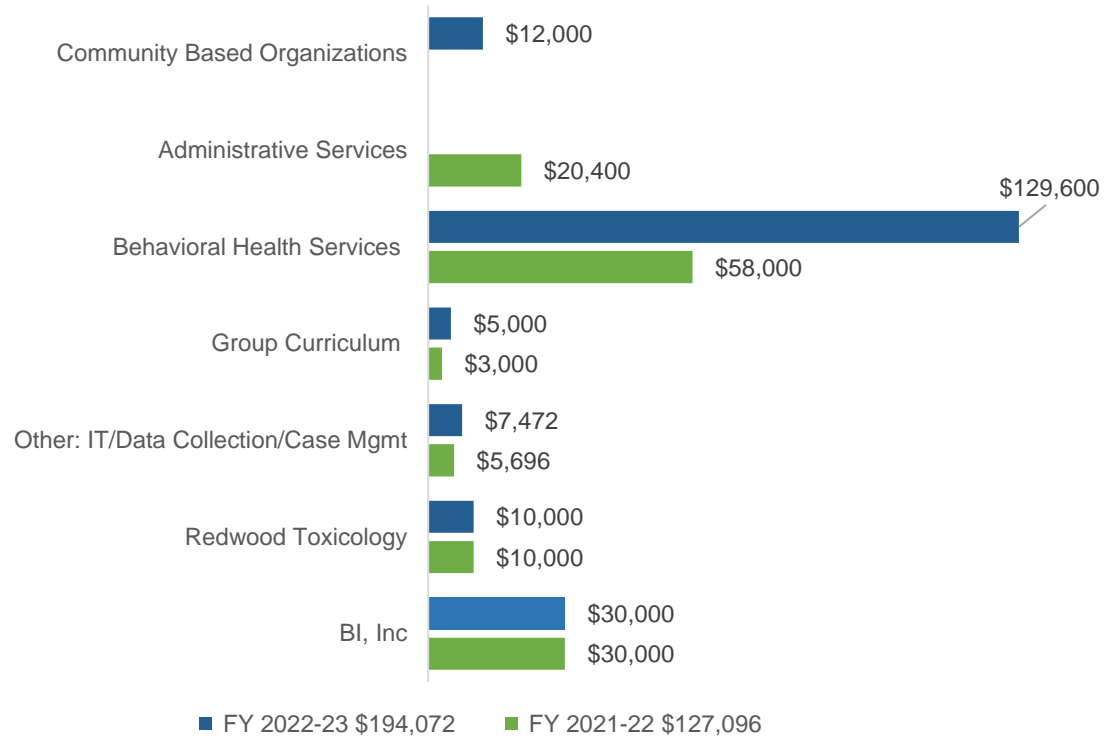
### FY 21-22 and 22-23 Allocations
