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KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES

8. Applicants must demonstrate the ability to perform high administrative and policy-influencing functions effectively. This overall ability requires the following specific knowledge and abilities:
9. Knowledge of the organization and functions of California State Government including the organization and practices of the Legislature and the Executive Branch; principles, practices, and trends of public administration, organization, and management; techniques of organizing and motivating groups; program development and evaluation; methods of administrative problem solving; principles and practices of policy formulation and development; and personnel management techniques.
10. Ability to plan, organize, and direct the work of multi-disciplinary professional and administrative staff; analyze administrative policies, organization, procedures and practices; integrate the activities of a diverse program to attain common goals; gain the confidence and support of top level administrators and advise them on a wide range of administrative matters; develop cooperative working relationships with representatives of all levels of government, the public, and the Legislative and Executive branches; analyze complex problems and recommend effective courses of action; prepare and review reports; and effectively contribute to the department's Equal Opportunity Office objectives.
11. Well-developed leadership, administrative, managerial and interpersonal skills and abilities
12. Scope of Position:

Under the administrative direction of the Director, the Assistant Deputy Director of the In Custody Death Review (ICDR) Division leads, plans, directs and coordinates the development, maintenance and revision of regulations, policies and procedures in support of the ICDR and the BSCC. The Assistant Deputy Director develops regulations, policies and procedures to conduct reviews of investigations of in-custody deaths, minimum standards to prevent and reduce in-custody deaths and ensure the safety and care of people housed in local detention facilities and provide recommendations to the facility administrator on how to prevent in-custody death based upon the reviews. The Assistant Deputy Director also administers BSCC's ongoing and regular regulation revision process that supports the establishment of operational standards for California's local adult and juvenile detention facilities. This position provides high level policy development and expertise and serves as a member of the BSCC's Executive Leadership Team.

Duties and Responsibilities:

(Candidates must perform the following functions with or without reasonable accommodations.)

- Lead, plan and organize the development of regulations, policies and procedures to guide the successful implementation of BSCC's In Custody Death Review program, which is responsible for conducting reviews of investigations of each death that occurs in a local detention facility. Direct and supervise staff in the development of those regulations, policies, and procedures and in the reviews of in-custody deaths. Develop, recommend, implement, and evaluate policies and procedures for conducting reviews and inspections including entrance and exit briefings, on-site performance measures, corrective action plans and mitigation, implementation planning, developing recommendations, and reporting to the Board. Interpret and apply state and federal law, budget language, regulations and policies related to detention facility operations and the delivery of medical and mental health care services. Serve as a member of BSCC's Executive Leadership Team. Represent the BSCC in discussions with the Governor's Office, Legislature, Department of Finance, state and local agencies, and stakeholders.
- Lead, plan, organize and evaluate BSCC's ongoing and regular regulation revision process. Facilitate processes to receive meaningful feedback for regulation revisions and development from internal and external subject matter experts, including community members. Ensure the regulation revision process complies with all requirements of the Office of Administrative Law, including public comment opportunity. Identify the need for and ensure thorough and appropriate distribution of information, tools, and training to support regulations changes, as necessary.
- Develop long and short-range goals to ensure the effective use of state resources and effective program implementation. Ensure that quality assurance procedures are in place and working to identify opportunities for process improvement. Direct and manage staff activities to ensure program effectiveness, efficiency and compliance with all governing statutes, policies, and procedures. Oversee the collection of program data and develop



management reports. Provide technical assistance and expert consultation to state, local and stakeholder agencies.

- Select and train staff. Evaluate the performance of subordinates. Prepare the program budget and monitor expenditures to contain costs within budget. Monitor resources and responsibilities and make staffing adjustments as necessary. Prepare contracts, Budget Change Proposals, Budget Concept Papers, etc. Direct staff in monitoring legislation affecting ICDR's program policies and operations and BSCC's standards for adult and juvenile detention facilities. Represent BSCC during legislative hearings and meetings with local government officials and professional organizations. Conduct investigations in sensitive areas. Coordinate with national policy and professional organizations on a broad range of policies and regulations relating to jail operations. Perform other duties as required.

DESIRABLE QUALIFICATIONS

- Executive-level experience developing and implementing statewide policies, regulations, or standards, particularly in public safety, corrections, health care, or other highly regulated environments.
- Demonstrated leadership in managing multidisciplinary teams responsible for complex program areas, policy development, inspections, investigations, or regulatory oversight.
- Expertise interpreting and applying state and federal laws related to detention facility operations, medical and mental health care delivery, or other systems involving high-risk or sensitive populations.
- Proven ability to lead large-scale regulatory revision processes, including public engagement, stakeholder collaboration, and compliance with Office of Administrative Law requirements.
- Strong analytical and strategic planning skills, including the ability to evaluate complex problems, develop effective solutions, and implement long- and short-range program goals.
- Exceptional communication and relationship-building skills, with experience representing an organization before executive leadership, legislative bodies, local governments, advocacy groups, and community stakeholders.
- Experience overseeing sensitive investigations or reviews, including the ability to exercise sound judgment, maintain confidentiality, and make ethical decisions in high-visibility or high-impact situations.
- Demonstrated ability to manage budgets, resources, and organizational priorities, including experience preparing Budget Change Proposals, contracts, or other administrative and fiscal documents.
