TRIBAL YOUTH DIVERSION GRANT

Total TYD funding for Cohort 2 is \$10 million including:

- \$9.7 million for new grants
- \$300,000 for BSCC administrative costs

\$9.7 million will support:

- 9 grantees
- Requests of \$600K - \$1.4 M

AUTHORIZING LEGISLATION

- ❖ **Funding: Budget Acts of 2018 & 2019**
- ❖ **Program: AB1812 & AB 1454**
- ❖ **Grantees are federally recognized Indian Tribes in California**
- ❖ **Funding must support:**
 - **Diversion programs for Indian children**
 - **Trauma-informed, community-based, and health-based interventions**

LEGISLATION (CONT.)

Target population is Indian children who are:

- ❖ Under 18
- ❖ Facing entry to the juvenile justice system or further involvement in the system
- ❖ Experience:
 - High rates of juvenile arrests
 - High rates of suicide
 - High rates of alcohol & substance abuse
 - Low high school graduation rates
