Grant Provisions Continued

Eligible Applicants: Cities and CBOs

- 100 percent match
- Cities required to pass through 50 percent to CBOs

Assembly Bill 1603

- Limited eligibility to cities that are disproportionately impacted by violence and the CBOs that serve them
- Expanded the type of organizations that were eligible to count towards a city's 50% pass-through
 - CBOs
 - Public agencies or departments that are primarily dedicated to community safety or violence prevention



Proposal Submission

Overview

- 55 Proposals Considered for Funding:
 - 5 cities
 - 37 CBOs
 - 13 Small Scope CBOs
- \$111 Million Requested
 - \$9.3 million from cities
 - \$97.7 million from CBOs
 - \$4.1 million from Small Scope CBOs



Projects Recommended for Funding

Category 2: CBOs	15	\$41,533,013
Category 3: Small Scope CBOs	9	\$2,565,161

Recommendation

The CalVIP ESC recommends that the Board

- Allocate the remaining FY 2021-22, 2022-23, and 2023-24 appropriations;
- Fully fund 5 city proposals, 14 CBO, and 8 small scope CBO proposals;
- Partially fund 1 CBO proposal and 1 small scope CBO proposal
- Authorize staff to continue to make awards from the rank-ordered list
