STATE ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON JUVENILE JUSTICE AND DELINQUENCY PREVENTION

May 18, 2016 Meeting

Issue: Update from the Juvenile Justice Standing Committee

As you may recall, the Juvenile Justice Standing Committee (JJSC) was formed to assist in fulfilling the statutory requirements in relation to a wide range of juvenile justice issues that fall within the purview of the BSCC. Its key Responsibilities include:

- Data and performance outcomes
- Juvenile Justice Realignment
- Juvenile Facility Regulations (Title 15)
- Juvenile justice grants monitoring & reporting tasks

The committee membership provides a vast array of diversity, expertise and geographic representation; each member represents an important discipline related to the mission to advise the Board on the primary juvenile justice mandates and issues that fall by code and by tradition to BSCC.

The Committee last met on April 11th, 2016 and in alignment with their Principles, they made the following formal motions to be presented to the BSCC Board.

- 1. <u>Juvenile Justice Statewide Strategic Plan</u>: Motion was made that the JJSC, from the onset, would like to be equal and active partners in the development of the Strategic Plan to include timeline, tasks and outcome development.
- 2. <u>Juvenile Justice Data Group</u>: Motion was made that the JJSC would like the Board to approve the commencement of an analysis for improvement of the JDPS (see Juvenile Justice Data Working Group recommendations).
- 3. <u>ESC Process</u>: Motion was made that the JJSC endorse a balanced and fair approach that's inclusive of both community and governmental participation.
- 4. <u>Regulation Revision Process</u>: Motion was made that the BSCC staff explore the more sensitive and common trends surfacing in CA for the purposes of review in advance of the Juvenile Regulation Revision process.

Moreover, the Committee entertained a broader conversation involving review of legislation likely to impact the upcoming regulation revision process including: SB 1004 Juvenile Hall Confinement; SB 1143 Juv. Det. Room Confinement (isolation); SB 1157 Video Visitation; and AB 2005 Out of State Placement of juveniles
