

Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act - Youthful Offender Block Grant 2019 Expenditure and Data Report Due Date: October 1, 2019

On or before October 1, 2019, each county is required to submit to the Board of State & Community Corrections (BSCC) a report on its Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act (JJCPA) and Youthful Offender Block Grant (YOBG) programs during the preceding year. For JJCPA this requirement can be found at Government Code (GC) Section 30061(b)(4)(C) and for YOBG it can be found at Welfare & Institutions Code Section (WIC) 1961(c). These code sections both call for a consolidated report format that includes a description of the programs and other activities supported by JJCPA and/or YOBG funds, an accounting of all JJCPA and YOBG expenditures during the prior fiscal year, and countywide juvenile justice trend data.

Prior to submitting this report save the file using the following naming convention: "(County Name) 2019 JJCPA-YOBG Report." For example, Yuba County would name its file "Yuba 2019 JJCPA-YOBG Report".

Alpine County Probation has no juvenile figures to report from January 1, 2018 to December 31, 2018. Youthful Offender Block Grant has afforded Alpine County with prevention programs to help our youth cope while in a very remote area of California.

pine County has a population of 1175 according to the 2010 census. The population continues to decline each year due to the lack of job opportunities for residents and new families. Most residents are employed as seasonal employees at the winter resorts, county jobs, or have a minimum commute of 30 to 45 minutes to either South Lake Tahoe, California or Nevada. The 2010 census listed Alpine County as Frontier/Wilderness, not large enough to be considered rural. There are 5 pockets of population; Bear Valley, Kirkwood, Markleeville, Woodfords, and Hung-a-lel-ti. There are isolated homes where juveniles cannot walk to visit friends or socialize. Cell phone service is sparse which means contact with outside areas is limited. Bear Valley is cut off from the rest of the county for the winter months when highway 4 is closed due to hazardous conditions. In 2018.19 there were 2 school. For the 2019.20 school year there are 2 schools. Diamond Valley School in Woodfords with 82 students enrolled and an extension school in Bear Valley with only 2 students enrolled. These schools are K-8th grade. High School students either go to South Lake Tahoe, Calaveras County, California, or Douglas County, Nevada. The majority of Alpine County students graduate High School in Nevada. Only 5% of Alpine County is in private ownership due to small amounts of private land and expensive housing costs. Alpine County has extreme winters which make travel sometimes impossible in the winter. It is a very mountainous region of the Sierra Nevada Mountain Range, known to locals as the California Alps. It is a county of beauty, wildlife and extremities. Living in Alpine County is hard on adults. The youth of the county struggle with needs that include; activities, mentoring, positive interventions, and support for developing coping skills for the outside world they have limited exposure to. Alpine County's juvenile population has benefited greatly from the Youthful Offender block Grant supported programs which keep the offender population low and "at risk" children busy with more productive positive activities and away from truant and criminal activities idle minds are attracted to. The programs supported by YOBG funds include family and teen activities that encourage the youth and families to participate in activities they may never be exposed to without this grant. There was also a bullying program through the school and a mentoring program modeled after "Big Brothers/Big Sisters" programs. The mentoring program is no longer funded by YOBG because it was abandond during the 2018.19 school year due to employment issues by the program and ther remote area of Alpine County

This program is geared toward "at risk" children, teens, and their families in the communities of Alpine County. The Atmosphere is always drug and alcohol free, encouraging interaction between participants. Electronic devices are prohibited in an effort to promote conversation and inclusion. There are strict codes of conduct geared toward appropriate language, actions and dress for activities. There is a high number of Native and non-Native American participation in an effort to encourage a building of cultural bridges. Some of the activities that this program provided access to were: a county fair, health fair, museums, dinners, movies, Christmas show, bowling, swim center, story time, fishing, and Six Flags. Through this program, the cost of admission, food, and transportation is paid so the families can experience new and different activities. This program provides the youth activities that are available to them in the county but they may not be able to take advantage of. For the youth in Alpine County and their families to learn how to play together through drug and alcohol free outings helps them with peer pressure now and later in life. This program encourages families to enjoy positive time together. The program also provides opportunities for teens and families to expand their life experiences and become positive, productive members of the community.

The Alpine Mentoring program affords "at-risk" youth an opportunity to be matched with a caring adult in an effort to provide some stability in the child's life. The children involved in this project are typically from homes without a father figure or lack of strong parental guidance due to their caregiver's substance abuse. These youth may be "at-risk" of engagement in problem behaviors such as delinquency, drug use, teen pregnancy, or truancy because of a lack of supervision and adult role models. The mentoring program is designed to buffer these "at-risk" youth against risk factors while encouraging protective boundaries. Tahoe Youth and Family Services provide a Mentoring Project in order to decrease delinquent behavior and increase the capacity of Alpine County to provide an effective continuum of response to juvenile crime and delinquency. This is an evidence- based strategy used to provide individual mentoring, youth development clubs, youth prevention and recreational activities, in an effort to address "at-risk" juveniles in the county. Specific goals and objectives of the project is to recruit new members while sustaining mentor/ mentee matches from the previous year as well as data collection, monthly recruitment and presentations.
