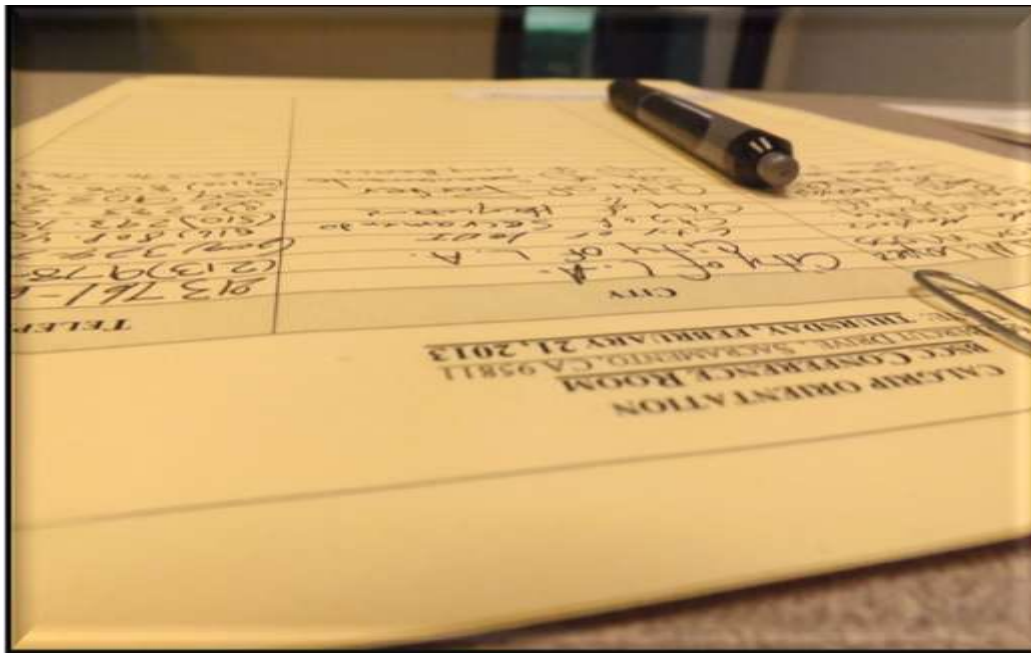


California Gang Reduction, Intervention and Prevention Program

The California Gang Reduction, Intervention, and Prevention (CalGRIP) Program provides funding to cities using a local collaborative approach for gang prevention, intervention, and suppression activities. Most cities receiving CalGRIP funds use a comprehensive approach by including prevention, intervention and suppression activities. The next few pages provide a simple overview of how the current CalGRIP funds are being spent, and the types of evidence-based approaches being used. Generally speaking **Prevention** programs target youth at risk of gang involvement and help reduce the number of youth who join gangs; **Intervention** programs and strategies provide sanctions and services for younger youth who are actively involved in gangs to push them away from gangs, and **Suppression** strategies and intensive services target active gang activities within communities.

Note: An additional funding opportunity is scheduled for release in August 2013.

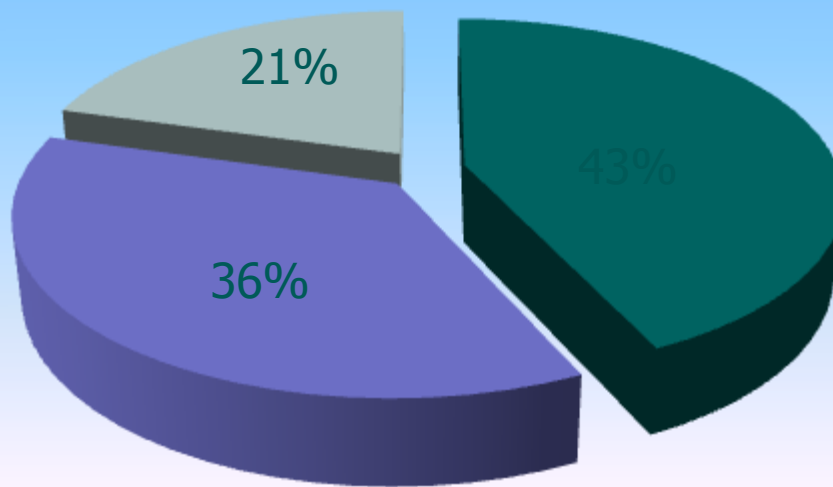


California Gang Reduction, Intervention and Prevention Program

CalGRIP grant funds are identified as Prevention, Intervention, and/or Suppression Services. The chart illustrates the approach for all CalGRIP funds currently being used (awards from the 2011 and 2012 Budget Act).

\$7.9 Million towards Prevention Services

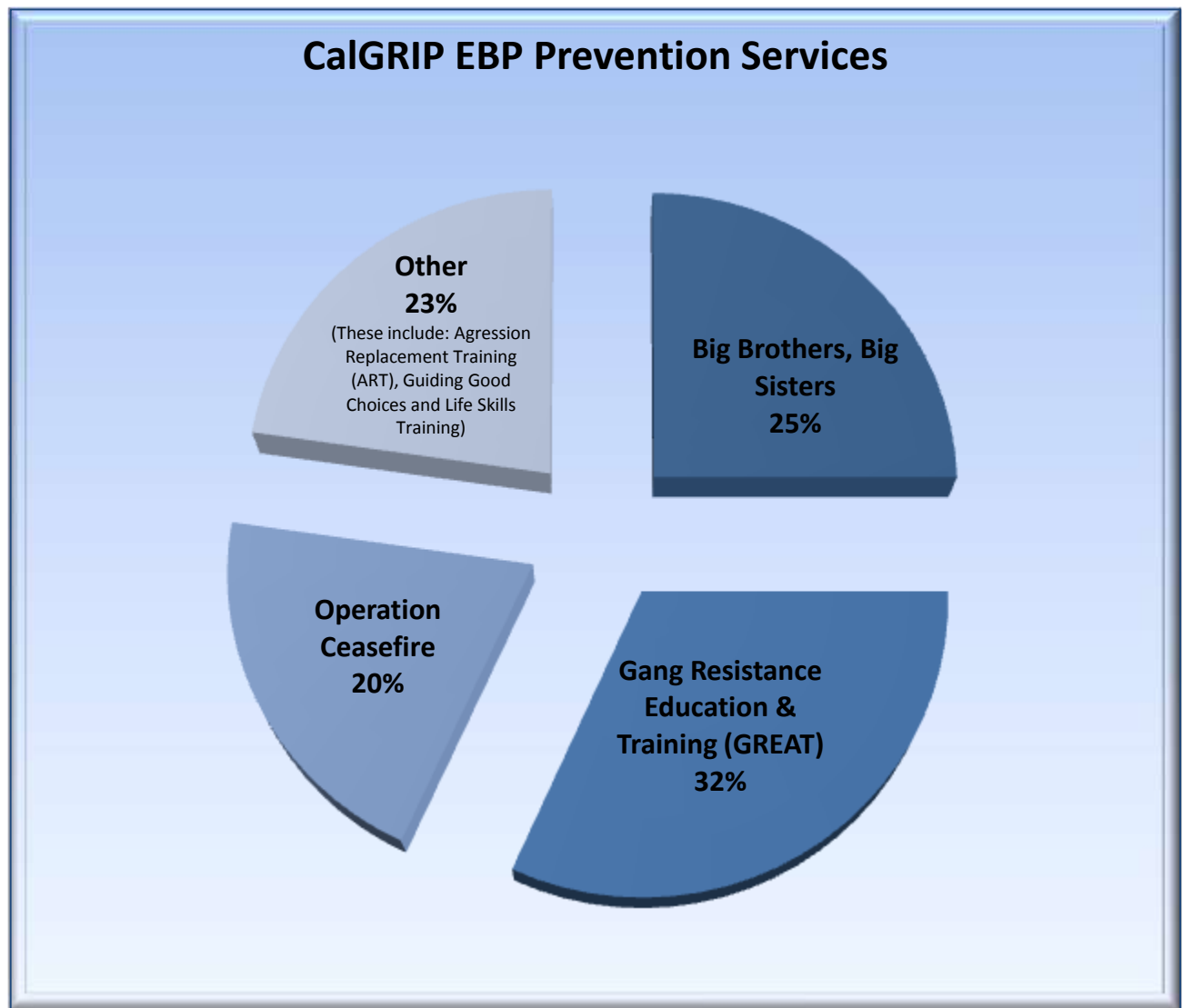
\$6.9 Million towards Intervention Services

Total Funds = \$18.4 Million

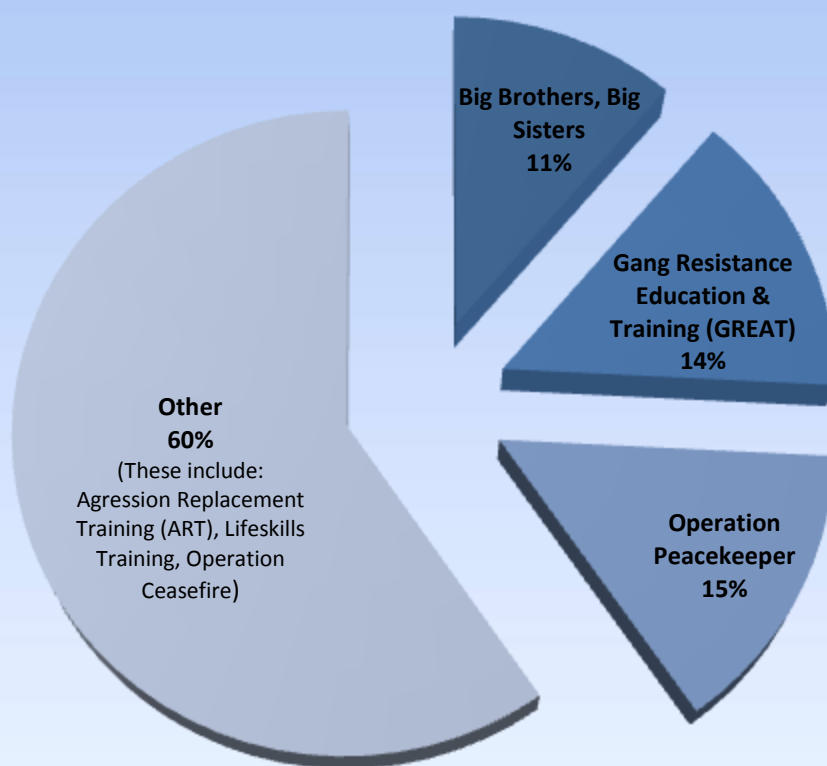
California Gang Reduction, Intervention and Prevention Program

Evidence-Based Programs, Practices and Strategies (EBP) place an emphasis on achieving measurable outcomes and making sure that the services provided and the resources used are effective. The CalGRIP Program has historically recommended recipients utilize EBPs in the implementation of their projects. The Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) made this recommendation a requirement, and asked grantees to identify the EBPs being applied in the 2012/2014 Request for Proposals. 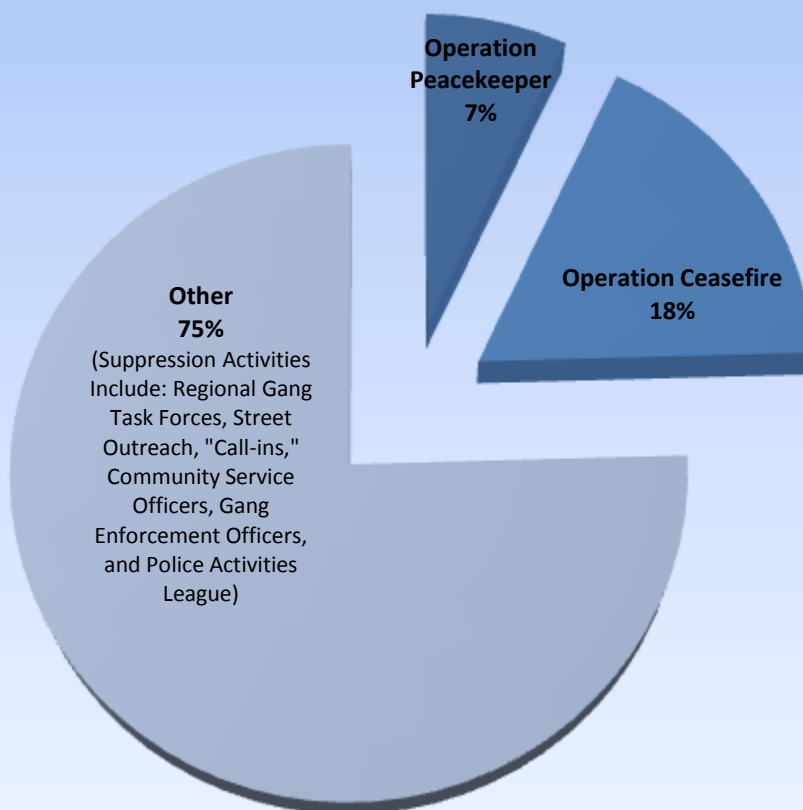

CalGRIP Data Outcomes

The Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) is making every effort to identify the progress of the CalGRIP Grants to ensure their effectiveness within local communities. The BSCC currently requires grantees to:

- Submit quarterly progress reports which included common data variables amongst all of the grants, and
- Submit a local evaluation at the conclusion of their grant period.

Additionally, on April 1, 2013 BSCC is required to submit a report and evaluation of CalGRIP grants to the fiscal committee of the legislature.
