SUBJECT: AVAILABLILITY OF FUNDING FOR THE CALIFORNIA VIOLENCE

INTERVENTION AND PREVENTION GRANT PROGRAM

The Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) is announcing the re-release of the California Violence Intervention and Prevention (CalVIP) Grant Program, Request for Proposals (RFP). The CalVIP RFP makes \$53,440,829 available competitively, provided that funding is appropriated through the State Budget Act in fiscal years 2022-23 and 2023-24. Successful projects will be funded from October 1, 2022 to June 30, 2025, with an additional six months for evaluation.

The purpose of the CalVIP Grant Program is to improve public health and safety by supporting effective violence reduction initiatives in communities that are disproportionately impacted by violence, particularly group-member involved homicides, shootings, and aggravated assaults. Eligible applicants for the CalVIP Grant are California cities that are disproportionately impacted by violence and the community-based organizations (CBOs) that serve them.

CalVIP proposals must be received by the BSCC by **5:00 p.m. on Friday, July 15, 2022**. The RFP is available on the BSCC <u>website</u>.
