Scope of Position:

Under general direction of the Deputy Director of Administration, Research and Program Support, (CEA III), and with lead direction from the Research Specialist V, the Research Program Specialist perform a wide variety of research and statistical studies in the completion of technical research for the three Board of State and Community Corrections divisions (Standards and Training for Corrections (STC), Corrections Planning and Programs (CPP), and the Facilities Standards and Operations/County Facilities Construction (FSO/CFC).

Duties and Responsibilities:

(Candidates must perform the following functions with or without reasonable accommodations.)

- Design, plan and conduct special research projects, complex studies, and statistical analyses (exam development, job analysis, analyses for reporting, grant proposals, etc.); prepare and present technical reports and make recommendations to program management based on findings; and provide expert consultation and technical support to staff on the feasibility, design and impact of research projects.
- Design, test, and implement a wide variety of large scale surveys using scientific survey design and sampling methodology; and conduct, document and present results of analyses of survey data.
- Coordinate and oversee the research efforts of staff and outside contractors and consultants; act as a principal point of contact for all data compilation and evaluation efforts; and develop and maintain working partnerships with state, local, public and private entities.
- Develop and implement statistical methodologies, performance measurement tools, resource materials and techniques to evaluate program performance. Provide technical assistance to local corrections partners as needed.
