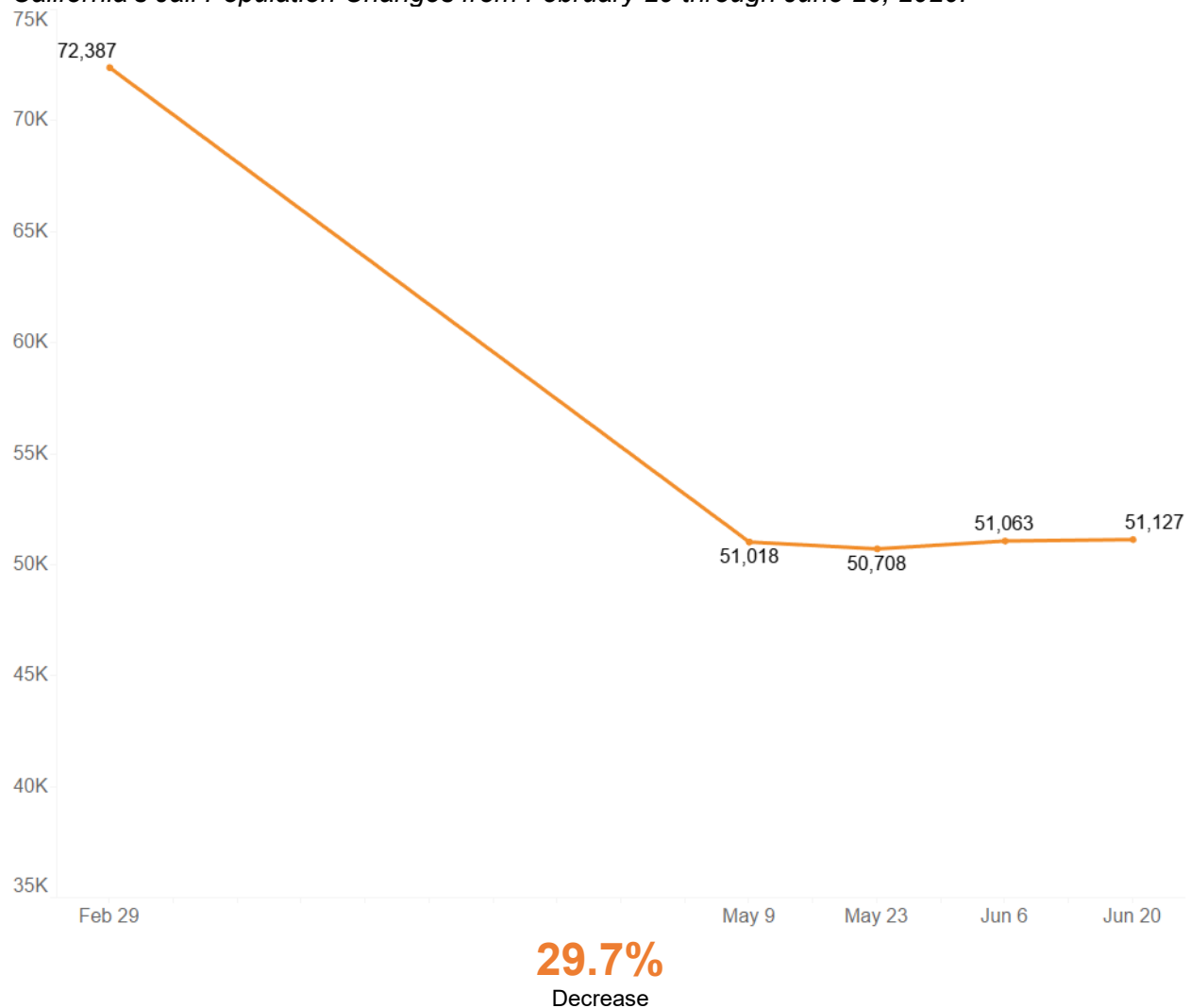


County Jail Populations During COVID-19

June 26, 2020

During the COVID-19 emergency, California has experienced a reduction in county jail populations. California's jail population on February 29, 2020 was estimated to be 72,387.¹ The population reached a low point on May 23 of 50,708. As of June 20, the jail population was 51,127.² In the 16 weeks between February 29 and June 20, there has been a 29.7 percent reduction in the jail population.

¹ February Jail Profile Survey (JPS) reports were used to estimate baseline data for the average daily population (ADP) for the week of February 23, 2020. The February ADP was used as the week's estimate.

² Supplemental JPS reports for the week of June 20, 2020 were used for the June 20, 2020 ADP estimate. Supplemental JPS data are collected weekly. June 20, 2020 data reflected the ADP for the week of June 14 – June 20, 2020. Some counties have yet to report for June 20, 2020 and the most recent Supplemental JPS report prior is used; please see the table 1 for more details.

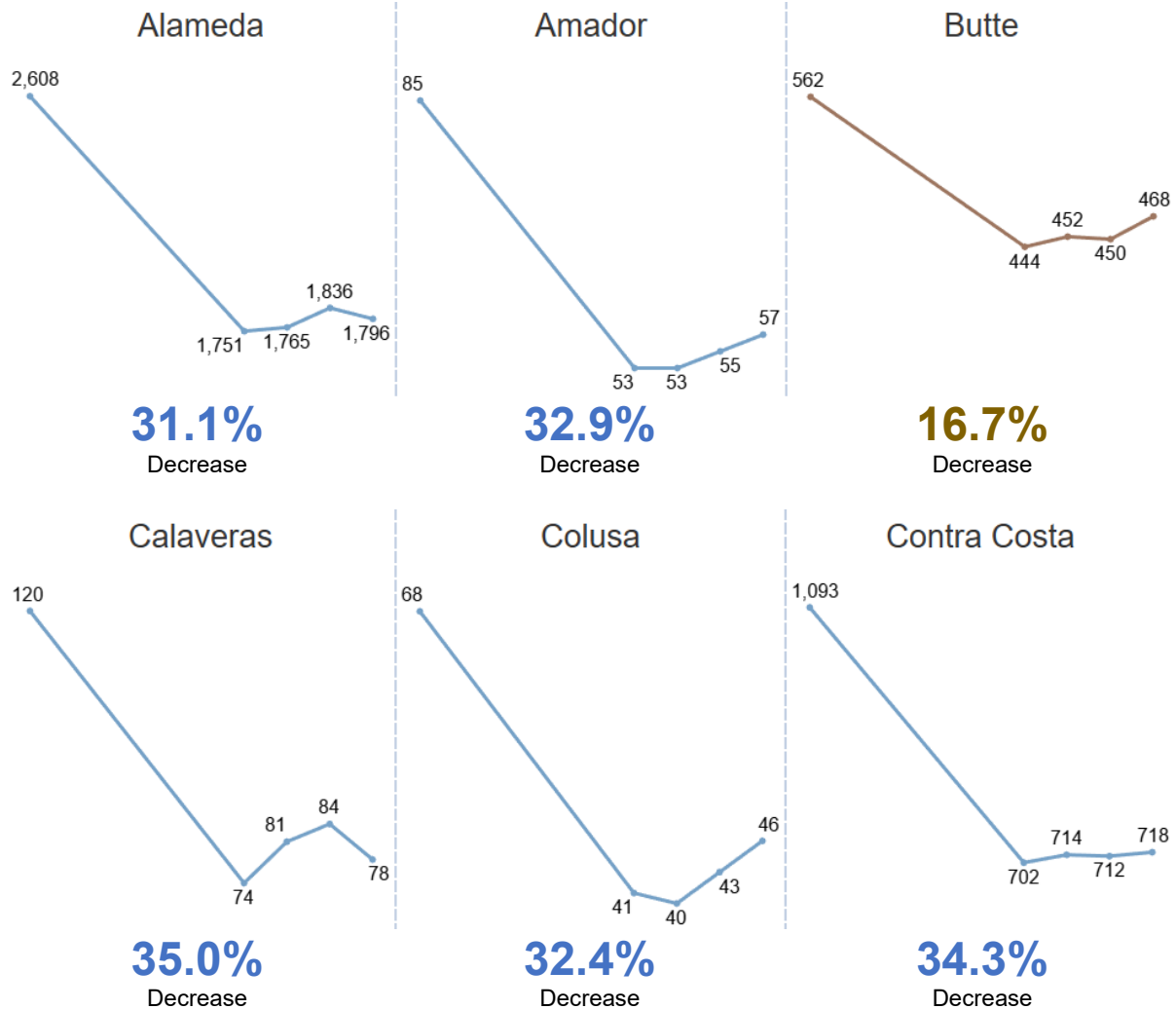

These decreases have varied across counties. The figures that follow provide each county's average daily population (ADP) for five dates: (1) February 29, 2020, (2) May 9, 2020, (3) May 23, 2020, (4) June 6, 2020, and (5) June 20, 2020. The percent change between the February 29, 2020 and June 20, 2020 dates is shown below the figure. Percent change values were classified and color-coded into the following categories:

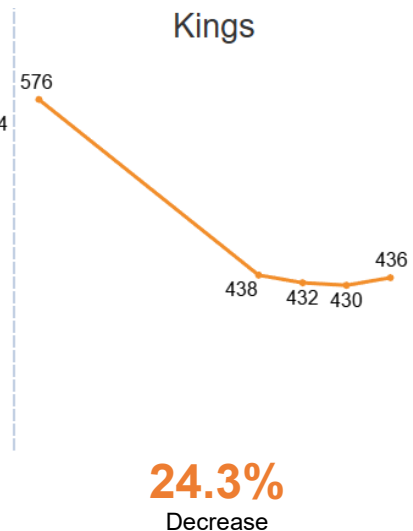
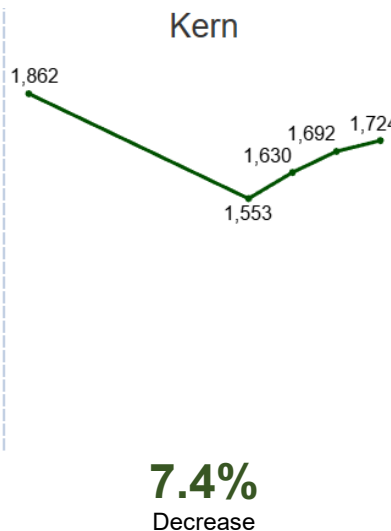
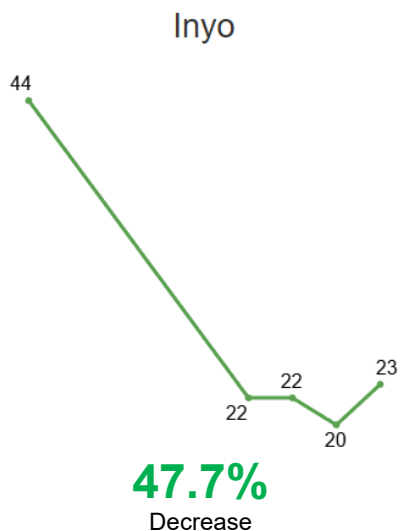
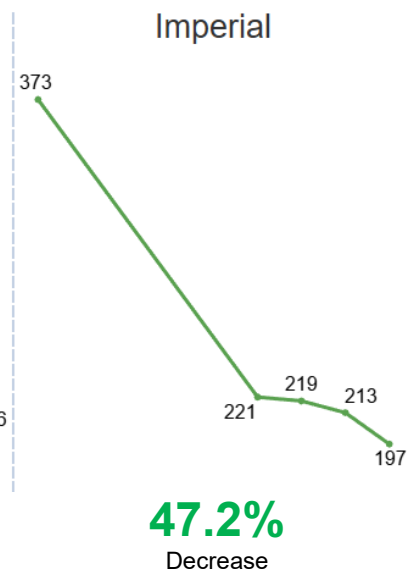
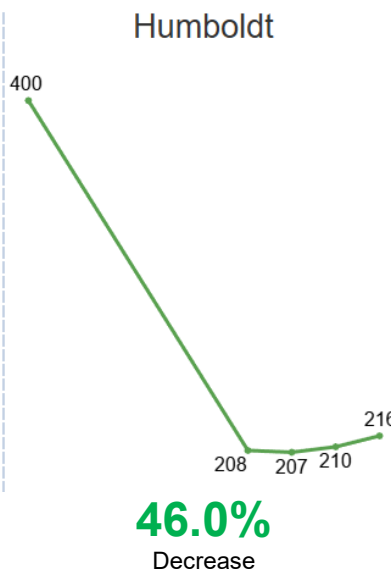
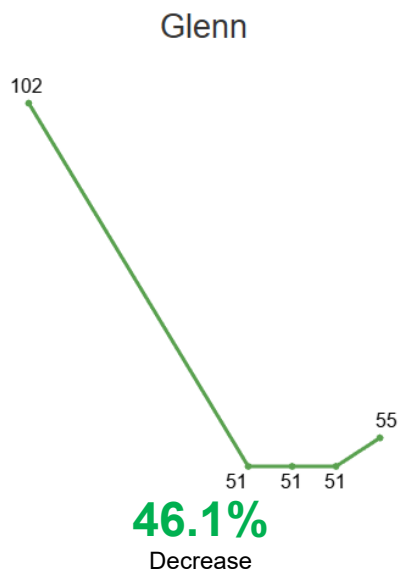
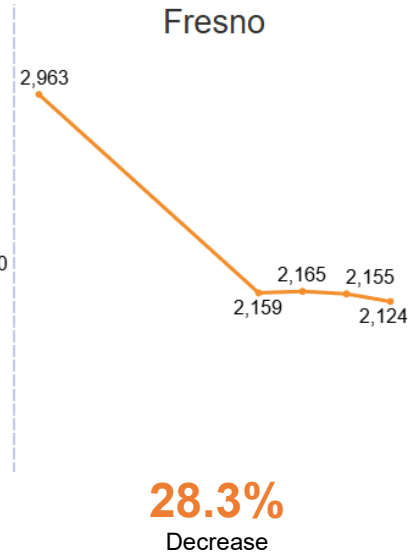
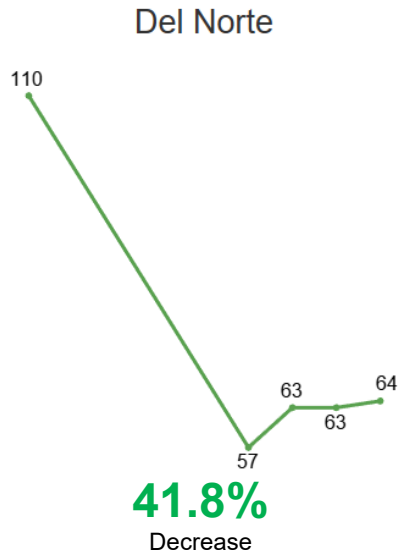
- Decrease less than 9.9%
- Decrease between 10% through 19.9%
- Decrease between 20% through 29.9%
- Decrease between 30% through 39.9%
- Decrease between 40% through 49.9%
- Decrease of 50% or greater

Diverse patterns among counties reflect not only differences in policy approaches, but other county-specific factors. The BSCC does not collect details on county policies that may influence these data and cautions against inferences about the comparative performance of counties.



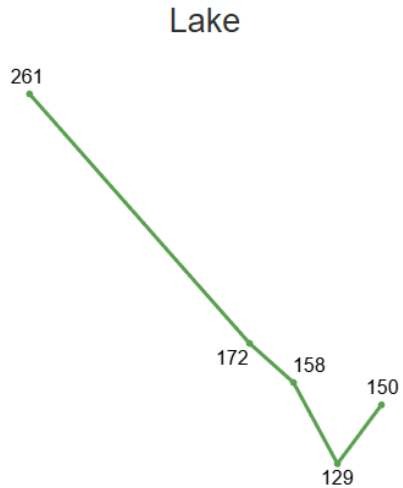
