# Medication-Assisted Treatment Grant Program Scoring Panel Seeking Membership

The Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) is seeking members to serve on a Scoring Panel for the Medication-Assisted Treatment Grant Program. Statements of Interest for this Scoring Panel will be taken until a full membership has been reached.

## **Medication-Assisted Treatment Grant Program**

Assembly Bill 653 requires counties receiving competitive MAT grants to fund the treatment of substance use disorders with the provision of medication-assisted treatment. The bill also requires grant-funded counties to collect and maintain data on the effectiveness of the program. County data will be compiled into a final report to the Legislature describing the activities funded by the grant program and the success of those activities in reducing drug overdoses and recidivism by people housed in jail and people under criminal justice supervision (i.e., probation, post-release community supervision, and mandatory supervision). In September 2022, Governor Newsom approved Assembly Bill 179 amending the Budget Act of 2022 to include \$10 million for a new MAT Grant Program to be administered by the BSCC.

## **Considerations for MAT Grant Program Scoring Panel Membership**

Individuals interested in serving on this Scoring Panel should be prepared to attend two to three days of training, work independently to review and rate the proposals, and work with BSCC staff to produce award recommendations for BSCC Board approval. Each proposal will take one to three hours to read and score.

Scoring Panel members should reflect California's population and diverse racial, ethnic, geographic, gender, and cultural perspectives and backgrounds. There are important responsibilities and considerations that you must review before determining whether you can serve on this Scoring Panel, such as:

- Time commitment:
