


AB109 Training

During the first year of AB109 implementation, Probation Officers and Community Partners participated in over 3,500 hours of training relating to evidence based practice.




AB109 Implementation


The Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) received a 4.2 million dollar allocation for fiscal year 2011-2012. During the first year of implementation, the allocation was distributed in the areas of supervision, incarceration, and treatment; primarily focusing on the PRCS population first. Approximately 1.6 million of unspent money was rolled over to fiscal year 2012-2013.




Monterey County Jail Population



Monterey County Jail Population




Post Release Community Supervision (PRCS)








8.7% of the PRCS population is homeless, primarily residing in Salinas

In the first year of AB109 implementation, 4.7 % of inmates released to Monterey County failed to report to the Probation Department, and arrest warrants were issued.


Percentage Each Month of Inmates Who Failed To Report Following Release




Post Release Community Supervision Levels

221 ORAS Risk Assessments have been completed for the PRCS population which determines the level of supervision provided by the Probation Department.


62% of the population is receiving "Intensive Supervision" which entails extensive in-person contact, field visits, on-going assessments, case planning, and service delivery focused on the identified criminogenic needs.



Revocation Petitions: Within the last 12 months, a petition for PRCS revocation was filed with the court for 12% of the population.




PRCS Case Closures and Outcomes

Within the last year, 60 PRCS cases have been closed, primarily due to cases being transferred to other counties. Supervision of PRCS cases can extend to 3 years, however all PRCS cases must be closed after 12 months of supervision if there have been no violations resulting in a return to jail custody.




1170 (h) Sentences

Penal Code 1170(h) allowed judges to impose a local prison term, or a split sentence of a local prison term followed by a mandatory term of supervision for offenders convicted of a non-serious, non-violent, non-sexual offense. After 1 year of implementation, 285 offenders received an 1170(h) sentence. 15 Offenders were given a split sentence.




1170(h)(5)(b) Mandatory Supervision (Split Sentences)


Utilization of the 1170(h)(5)(b) Split Sentence is expected to increase during Monterey County's second year of AB109 implementation. Future utilization of evidence based sentencing will likely contribute to an increase of individuals being placed on Mandatory Supervision.







