SUBJECT: **Availability of Funding for the Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) Grant Program**

The Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) is announcing the release of a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) Grant Program.

This federal grant makes \$7.5 million available to California counties that operate local adult detention facilities. The grant is intended to fund substance use disorder (SUD) treatment for local adult populations during detention or incarceration, evidence-based SUD treatment in jails, reentry programs to assist individuals with reintegration into the community, and community-based treatment and other recovery aftercare services. Eligible applicants may apply for up to \$1,500,000 for the three-year grant period. An additional six months will be provided for audit, evaluation and close-out.

Proposals must be submitted by **5:00 p.m. on Friday, February 2, 2024**. Additional information regarding the RSAT Grant and instructions on how to apply are available on the BSCC website at https://www.bscc.ca.gov/s_rsat/

A virtual Grant Information Session will be held via Zoom on **December 14, 2023** at 10:00 a.m. A link to the virtual Grant Information Session is provided within the RFP and will be posted on the BSCC website.
