Title II funds can be used for efforts such as:

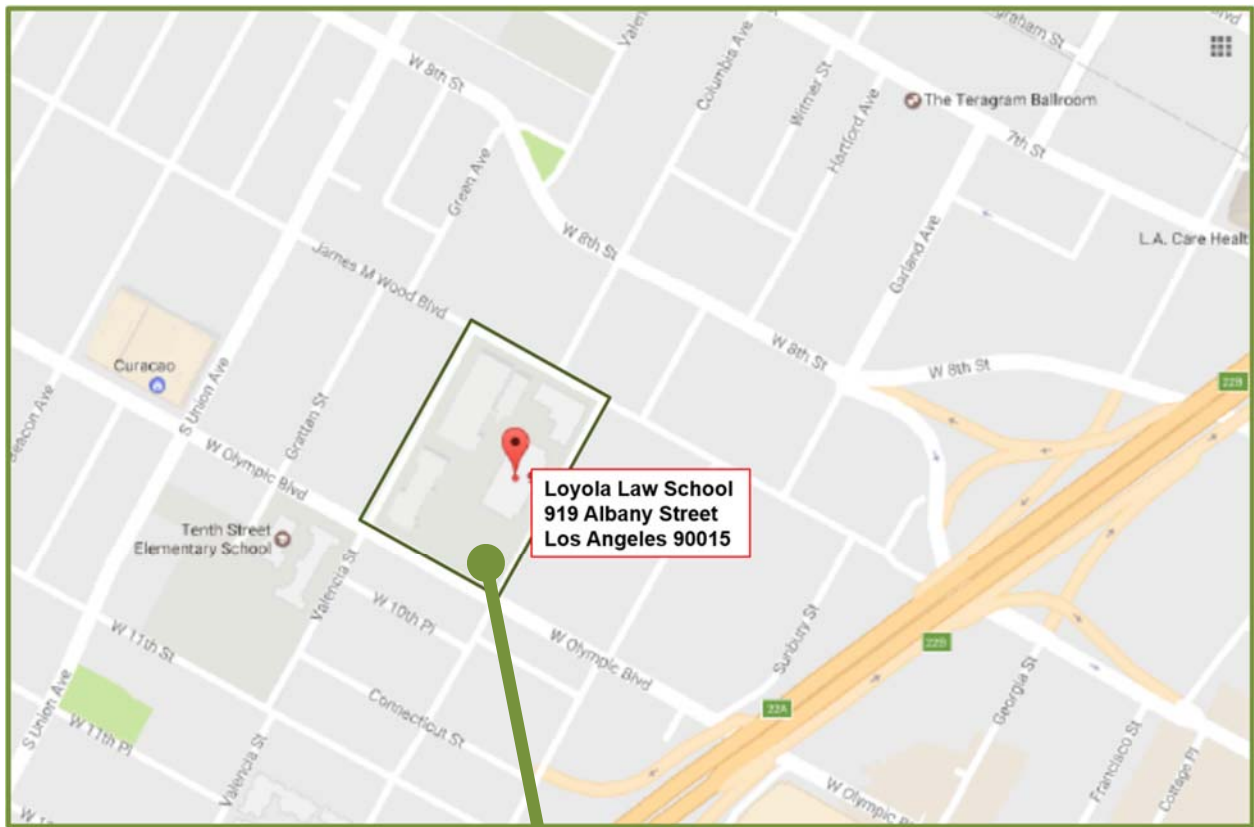
- Reducing racial and ethnic disparities
