EXPLANATION OF RESULTS

This document is an addendum to the <u>Third Quarter Calendar Year 2023 JDPS Trends document</u>. The <u>Juvenile Detention Profile Survey (JDPS)</u> began collecting population data for Secure Youth Treatment Facilities (SYTFs) in January 2023 with the counties reporting population figures for the month of December 2022 forward. The following pages provide population data for SYTFs obtained through the JDPS for the third quarter of 2023. The information below provides explanations and clarifications of the data presented.

Background

➤ On September 30, 2020, Governor Newsom signed Senate Bill 823, which began the closure of the state's Division of Juvenile Justice (DJJ), realigning those state functions to county governments. Under SB 823, DJJ intake closed for most youth on July 1, 2021, and counties became fully responsible for housing, programming, and treatment of youth who can no longer be committed to DJJ. These new state-mandated local programs are referred to in this document as Secure Youth Treatment Facilities (SYTFs). Please note:

- This document presents SYTF data collected for July, August, and September 2023.
- This document includes only the SYTFs in operation in September of 2023 and for which the Board of State and Community Corrections was notified of the operation of the facility as required by Senate Bill 92 (Chapter 18, Statutes of 2021). - Paginning December 2022, every county with SYTFs in operation submits their data to the BSCC in a monthly data submission. While we make every effort to obtain the data and review the data for accuracy, including contacting individual counties for clarification, the BSCC cannot be responsible for data reporting errors made at the county level. These survey results report county data at the specific point in time in which it was posted (December 2023). However, upon request of the county, data can be updated as needed.

^{**}Since all youths committed to a SYTF are post-disposition, there are no areas in the survey to count the ADP for pre-disposition youths. Please consult the <u>JDPS workbook</u> for further information on JDPS reporting methods.
