In recent years, there have been several changes in state laws that weigh in a factor between the difference in Felony, Misdemeanor, and Status arrests. Although the numbers above are identified as arrest, an unidentified number of them are a reflection of citations from law enforcement agencies; that relate to Truancy and other Educational Code Violations. Those are settled in Traffic Court and not through the Probation Department.

The San Bernardino County Probation Department recognizes there are specific needs for the youth in the community and strives to identify and address those needs in the most effective manner. Over the last ten plus years, the population in our Juvenile Detention and Assessment Centers (JDACs) have declined along with the number of system involved youth in the community. In response, there has been a shift in the criteria of our JDACs to focus on detained youth with serious and violent offenses. Youth in custody have shown signs of behavior that require the need for specialty mental health, socialization and rehabilitative services. As a result of the lower in-custody population, we continue to expand services in our community with a focus on prevention and intervention. In both environments, a balanced approach is foundational to success.

Collaborative efforts with other agencies including the District Attorney, the Public Defender, county and city law enforcement agencies, the Court, Department of Behavioral Health, Children and Family Services as well as city and county school districts have been forged as a means to identify those (vast) needs and collaboratively implement solutions through early intervention, prevention and rehabilitative services. The San Bernardino County Probation Department has allocated numerous resources with a focus on prevention and intervention. In addition, supervision officers working with those youth under court ordered supervision utilize some of the same approaches to stem the tide and successfully rehabilitate youth. As mentioned, our Detention system provides resources from internal and external stakeholders as appropriate to meet the needs for detained youth. Programming and treatment services are available at varying degrees based on the length of a youth's stay. Services are coordinated through intake, detention and release for continuity of care. Our collaborative approach are facilitated and codified through Memorandum of Understandings (MOUs) and protocols as appropriate. Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) meetings as well as Child and Family Team (CFT) meetings serve as a conduit to ensure appropriate services and service levels are provided throughout the continuum of care.

The San Bernardino County Probation Department does not limit or isolate services to any individual area in the county. The focus is to work collaboratively within our allied partners and other community based services to provide the same or similar services to youth and their families without concern relative to geographic location. Given the vastness of this region, the Department strives to provide the necessary resources to meet the demands of both urban communes as well as remote desert enclaves. The San Bernardino County Probation Department diversifies the services of youth and families based on identified needs. JJCPA funding allows for a partnership with county and city school districts which, in turn, allows Probation Officers to be located on various school campuses throughout different regions of the county. Additionally, there are several Juvenile Day Reporting Centers (DRCs) located throughout San Bernardino County.

Services provided are for the benefit of youth and the community as a whole. At each school site and DRC, youth can attend a variety of treatment classes including but not limited to Drug and Alcohol, Anger Management, Truancy and Cognitive Life Skills, as well as tutoring. There are also gender specific classes available such as Girls Circle and Boys Council. When deemed appropriate, through a referral process, Individual, Family and Group Counseling are also viable treatment options. The immediate presence of officers at each location allows for school staff, law enforcement agencies and probation to work together in a cohesive manner to identify needs of youth and their families who may be in the early, middle or advanced stages of assistance.

Probation Officers providing community supervision services effectively utilize the available resources though effective case management. Officers collaborate with other agencies as necessary to ensure best practice in efforts to facilitate pro-social behavior and positive outcomes.

Evidence Upon Which It is Based:

School attendance is a key factor in keeping youth out of the juvenile justice system. Prevention and Intervention programs lead the way at identifying and serving school age youth in efforts to keep them off the delinquency path. San Bernardino County has committed numerous resources in this endeavor.

Description:

Let's End Truancy (L.E.T.) is a collaborative multi-agency program, lead by the District Attorney's Office, designed to combat the rate of truancy within the San Bernardino County and City School Districts. The overall goal of the program is to increase the Average Daily Attendance (ADA) of students while reducing the negative impacts caused by truancy, including juvenile delinquency. This program targets youths in grades K-12 who are struggling with their school attendance as it is defined by the California Department of Education Code, EC 48260(a).

The District Attorney, Public Defender, Probation Officers and school personnel collaborate in efforts to intervene and work with not only the youth, but their families as well, to bring awareness to the youth's truancy and the impact (truancy) has on the youth's overall chances for success.

The intervention process may include the following: mediation, home visits, school visits and mentoring. When deemed necessary, a letter may be sent to the youth's parent/guardian which can escalate to the parent receiving a citation and mandatory appearance at a School Attendance Review Board (S.A.R.B.) meeting. Some youth and their parent/guardian may also be required to participate in individual and family services.

Evidence Upon Which It is Based:

School Probation Officers on campus have the advantage of identifying and intervening in the early stages of a youth's delinquent behavior. In addition, addressing chronic absenteeism creates a significant impact on the youth's potential for success and avoiding encounters with the juvenile delinquency system. Another benefit compliments the push to increase the Average Daily Attendance (ADA). School Probation Officers activities benefit stabilized classrooms and help keep students invested in their educational success.

Description:

This program is designed to reduce delinquent behavior on school campuses while simultaneously providing prevention, intervention and rehabilitative services to those students who exhibit behaviors or who have been identified as needing services. This includes youths with behavioral, mental health, supervision/expulsion, attendance and educational comprehension/performance issues. Campus staff, including teachers, Probation Officers and counselors, are provided with training and skills to identify, assess and work with those youth through a collaborative approach.

School personnel work closely with campus assigned Probation Officers. Communication underlies the efforts to identify at risk youth in need of or who can benefit from services. The Probation Officer contacts the youth and makes the necessary referrals for the appropriate services, as appropriate. These services include, but are not limited to, tutoring, individual and/or family counseling, attendance support (LET/SARB) and intervention services/programming.

The primary responsibility for these officers is Prevention and Intervention. However, best practice advocates officers assigned to the program also participate in general probation activities to increase community awareness, maintain continuity of service, provide case management and maintain proficiency.

Evidence Upon Which It is Based:

With three locations positioned geographically throughout San Bernardino County to meet the needs of system involved youths and families, the DRCs provide clients a variety of services available to them on a voluntary basis as well as those ordered by the Court. Additionally, Probation Officers provide similar classes at school sites. These programs improve the likelihood of success for the clients thereby decreasing potential recidivism or prolonged system involvement.

Description:

San Bernardino County Probation Department has three Juvenile Day Reporting Centers (DRCs). Each one provides specialized services, programming, and activities for youth 11-17 years of age. The DRCs serve at-risk youth, youthful offenders, and Probation involved youth. Classes offered at the DRC include Anger Management (levels 1&2), Drug and Alcohol (levels 1&2), Truancy, Gang Involvement (levels 1 & 2), Cognitive Life Skills, Graffiti, Shoplifting, Traffic Safety, JOBTEC (Job Skills), Victim Awareness, Weapons Diversion, Petty Theft, Deceptions (human trafficking awareness), Food Handler's Cards classes, Boy's Council, and Girl's Circle. A majority of these classes use material from the National Curriculum and Training Institute (NCTI), which is cognitively designed, evidence based, and research proven. It has also been demonstrated to be effective in changing behavior and reducing recidivism rates. Parenting classes and Parent Project classes are also offered for the parents of these youth. Parent Project addresses the most difficult problems with adolescents and some of the goals are to strengthen the family unit, improve school attendance and grades, reduce school, community and family violence, decrease youth gang involvement and reduce teen alcohol and drug use.

The DRC's offer a variety of other social activities for youth in the community. There are parent bonding nights and holiday events, such as pumpkin carving, holiday gift making, painting and creating crafts. Youth are able to participate in community service events, such as holiday hospital visits, blanket making for veterans, and helping with local food banks. DRC's organize and host summer day camps for youth in their region as a pro-social alternative to negative activities plaguing youth during the summer including involvement with drugs, alcohol, gangs and criminal activity. The DRC serves as a summer refuge and intervention by engaging youth in positive and engaging activities rich with learning opportunities. Summer camp consists of daily educational and age appropriate entertainment based activities.

Referrals are made to individual or family counseling as needed. You are afforded tutoring or other specific programming as appropriate and determined by the DRC staff. The DRC's partner with the San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools to offer alternative education on site.

All programs offered by the DRC rely on voluntary participation from attending youth/families. This program is not Court ordered. This program is a resource for youth and their families.

Evidence Upon Which It is Based:

This program serve as a resource system to effectively manage the population at the Juvenile Detention and Assessment Centers (JDAC's). The program provides the Probation Officer and the Courts the ability to release youth from the JDAC while undergoing Court proceedings. Following Probation screening or Court order, youth are provided an opportunity to remain in the community under the terms of the House Arrest Program. Appropriate participation in the program can have a positive effect on the Court proceedings and outcome.

Description:

Probation Staff assigned to the House Arrest Program (H.A.P.) help reduce the population in the Juvenile Detention and Assessment Centers by providing monitoring and limited supervision services for those youth who are awaiting disposition of their court proceedings. Supervision includes electronic monitoring and documentation of behaviors, including compliance or the lack thereof. It may also include the youth's involvement in community-based programs designed to identify and assist the youth with their problems. Many of the youth and their families are referred to the Day Reporting Centers for services.

House Arrest is a twenty-four (24) hour monitoring program utilizing risk specific guidelines to determine a youth's eligibility and participation in the program. In some cases, the youths and/or the families' unwillingness to adhere to the specific rules of the program prove to be a barrier and can preclude continuation of services. In such instances, the youth are returned to Court for a detention hearing. The primary responsibility for these probation officers is Prevention and Intervention. However, best practice advocates officers assigned to the program also participate in general probation activities to increase community awareness, maintain continuity of service, provide case management and maintain proficiency.

The Probation Department Field Services Supervision is the foundation of Court ordered community supervision. Youth granted probation have the opportunity to be monitored in the community in lieu of detention under terms and conditions ordered by the court. Supervision consists of home compliance checks, monitoring of school attendance and offering prevention and intervention services for youth and their families.

Description:

Probation field supervision units are tasked with the oversight of non 707-b offenders within the community. Each unit is developed to properly address the youth's needs while providing community safety and supervision. High Risk Supervision Units provide oversight of offenders deemed to be the most serious and sophisticated of offenders and present a higher risk to re-offend. Youth on this level of supervision are assigned to officers with a smaller caseload and have more intense supervision requirements. Medium Risk Supervision Units provide oversight of offenders identified as needing significant treatment intervention based on their criminogenic needs. These offenders' needs are targeted by utilizing Motivational interviewing techniques, rewards systems and a system of graduated sanctions. These offenders individualized treatment plans and the officer's smaller caseload size allows the officer to assist with the youth's behavior modification. Low Risk Offenders are deemed to be the least likely to re-offend. However, accountability for the behaviors displayed which resulted in their interaction with the juvenile courts, must also be addressed. These offenders primarily receive rehabilitation services such as counseling and community service.

Drug Court and CITA (Court Individualized Treatment of Adolescents) Court: Specialty Courts focusing on alcohol, drug and mental health concerns. A team approach with collaborative interaction between allied agencies such as the Court, Probation, DA, PD, DBH, CFS and contracted treatment providers. The goal is to reduce incarceration, decrease recidivism, advocate for treatment services and enhance community protection while eliminating future criminal behavior while improving the quality of life for youth living with drug/alcohol addiction and/or mental health issues.

GRACE (Gender Responsive Adolescent Caseload Enrichment): Focuses specifically on youthful female offenders to address the detailed trauma and coping mechanisms that present themselves with young girls.

Wraparound Program: The Wraparound Program focuses on strengthening the family as a whole so the at-risk youth can remain in the home. This is a team approach with a Probation Officer, therapist, Parent Partner, DBH, CFS, school officials and community members identified by the family and team as a strengthening force. The team meets with the youth and family regularly and helps by coordinating services, working through new coping skills and supporting the family and the youth in dealing with entrenched emotional, behavioral and mental health issues.

All Field Service Units and programs are designed to focus on prevention, intervention, community safety, supervision and rehabilitation. Strengthening families is also a primary goal.

Nature of Coordination with JJCPA:

The funds for this program are used for salaries (including benefits), overhead and various services and supplies. Funds are also used for youth counseling provided through the local Department of Behavioral Health and other training resources, all of which are necessary for the success of the program. Gateway uses Evidence-Based programming to assist the youths in their rehabilitation.

Description:

Gateway is a residential program providing rehabilitative services to youth committed by the Juvenile Court. Gateway provides twenty-four (24) hour supervision for male youth between the ages of 16 and 19, and has an overall bed capacity of forty (40). Gateway's two phased program is designed for youth achievement by promoting through several program levels. Level progression equates to achievement and earned privileges leading the youth towards family reunification, independent living and positive community reintegration. While at Gateway, youth are guided through the program by Probation staff who receive specialized training enabling them to recognize and best meet the needs of the youth in their care, custody and supervision. The officers are also able to serve as mentors and role models who coach, guide, direct and provide therapeutic support to the youth in the absence of their families. The officers manage to provide these services while also providing for the safety and security of the youth, community and the facility. While at Gateway, youth receive educational, medical and mental health services by employees trained in each specific area. Youth participate in component classes such as Aggression Replacement Training (A.R.T.), Parenting-Arise, Teen Dating, Phoenix (Gang Intervention) and MATRIX, a Substance Abuse Program. Additionally, youth are provided with employment preparation, job placement and participate in community service. Youth learn hands-on skills through the Regional Occupational Program (R.O.P.) and through successful skill leveling, earn "Home Furloughs," which aides in the gradual and successful reunification of the youth and their families. The program also provides a Probation Officer on-site as well as for aftercare services.

For example, you might want to include information on the types of youth served, prevention services you provided, your accomplishments, any barriers encountered, and what specifically JJCPA and/or YOBG funds paid for.
