

Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act - Youthful Offender Block Grant 2019 Expenditure and Data Report Due Date: October 1, 2019

These code sections both call for a consolidated report format that includes a description of the programs and other activities supported by JJCPA and/or YOBG funds, an accounting of all JJCPA and YOBG expenditures during the prior fiscal year, and countywide juvenile justice trend data.

Prior to submitting this report save the file using the following naming convention: "(County Name) 2019 JJCPA-YOBG Report." For example, Yuba County would name its file "Yuba 2019 JJCPA-YOBG Report".

Once the report is complete, attach the file to an email and send it to: **JJCPA-YOBG@bscc.ca.gov**. All reports will be posted to the BSCC website. We encourage you to review your report for accuracy before sending it to the BSCC. Please do **NOT** change the report form to a PDF document.

ANALYSIS OF COUNTYWIDE TREND DATA for: Santa Barbara

YOBG and JJCPA funding supports the majority of services, programs, and positions providing intervention and supervision to youthful offenders in Santa Barbara County. In addition to limited County General Funds and some Federal reimbursement through Title IV-E, these funds support services offered in the community and custody settings, the supervision of youth in the community, risk/needs assessments by court services staff, programs and services provided by various community-based organizations (CBO), and certain mental health evaluations performed by County mental health staff. YOBG and JJCPA directly support efforts to address juvenile delinquency and reduce recidivism by juvenile offenders.

The County continues to see a decrease in activity associated with juvenile delinguency and offenders over the course of the last several years, and particularly since 2017. The number of youth actively supervised by the Probation Department is currently 385 (July, 2019), a decrease from 480 in July of 2018 (decrease of 20%) and from 592 in July of 2017 (a decrease of 35%). This drop mirrors State trends that have seen the number of youth involved in the juvenile justice system decrease notably in the last seveal years (down 21% since 2016). Further, in 2017 and 2018, the Probation Department undertook an initiative to reshape and focus its juvenile operations to better align with State trends and the experiences of similar counties throughout the State. This process included comparing various data elements of the Santa Barbara juvenile justice system with four other counties selected for proximity, demographic similarity and progressive practices. Through this mining process, a need for a more comprehensive evidence-based risk and need assessment tool to assist the department in objectivity and individualizing its approach with youth was realized - one that provides a wider span of criminogenic risk and needs domains so that the department is able to tailor interventions and responses to each youth and family. The department has since adopted a contemporary and validated risk/needs assessment instrument as well as developed and implemented an incentives and interventions matrix, refined admission criteria for the juvenile hall (including admisisons for technical violations of probation), revised eligibility criteria for the Los Prietos Boys Camp (LPBC), and the use of specific CBO-provided curriculum for interventions with youth and their families. Addiitonally, juvenile providers have now joined the department's quality assurance committee to support the mainteance of fidelity to the new evidence based interventions launched.

YOBG and JJCPA funding supports the capacity of the Probation Department, CBOs, and partner agencies to properly assess, supervise, and intervene with youth who are referred to them. These local efforts and services have also contributed to a decrease in activity associated with youth in the juvenile justice system in other areas, including the average daily attendance for the juvenile hall decreasing from 56 to 33 between July of 2017 and July of 2018 (a 41% decrease) and the LPBC from 36 to 25 (a 31% decrease) in the same period. These efforts have also focused on keeping youth in their homes whenever possible and this has resulted in a drop of youth placements in residential group homes from 20 to zero in the same timeframe.

While overall youth involvement in crime in general and in the local juvenile justice system overall has declined, those youth that are formally involved in the system are generally involved for various serious and violent offenses. The focus on limiting the use of detention to those who represent a public safety risk or risk to themselves has resulted in the types of offenses youth are detained for becoming more serious. These include homicides, robberies, firearms offenses, and assaults resulting in injury, among others. Additionally, many detained youth are pending proceedings to determine the appropriate venue for the adjudication of their matter (criminal courts or juvenile court) for 707(b) WIC offenses. These youth receive intensive supervision services in the community, and are referred to evidence-based programs to address the needs of youth and families.

Three (3) Deputy Probation Officers (DPOs) are funded through YOBG and are assigned to supervise caseloads of high-risk youth in the three geographic regions of the county. These caseloads generally consist of older ganginvolved youth with histories of violence or serious offenses. One Probation Assistant (PA) is also funded through YOBG and provides support to DPOs who supervise cases. Officers perform case management and supervision functions and refer youth to a variety of community-based services. These services have historically included mentors who work with youth on employment, schooling, and vocational pursuits. Additionally, two (2) Juvenile Institutions Officers are funded through YOBG and serve as Community Transition Officers (CTO). The CTOs work with youth while they are at the LPBC and assist them in transitioning back to their homes and communities. They continue working with youth after completing the custody program and a subesquent aftercare compoent. CTOs augment community supervision by assisting with referrals, chemical testing, home visits, and school visits for the 90 day Aftercare period. The use of global positioning system (GPS) technology for enhanced supervision and accountability is also employed. Seven (7) DPOs are funded through JJCPA and are also assigned to supervise caseloads of high-risk youth in each of the geographic regions. These caseloads are more diverse in nature and include youth with a variety of offense histories. They include youth with mental health needs, youth with substance abuse problems, victims of human trafficking, and youth with significant trauma. The Juvenile Probation Manager's salary is split between YOBG and JJCPA funds with 60% of YOBG funds being used for this component. The Probation Manager provides oversight and direction to the two Supervisors overseeing these programs, and contract oversight and monitoring for the CBOs funded by YOBG. JJCPA pays for one Supervisor FTE.

The Probation Department has an agreement with the County Behavioral Wellness Department for two (2) clinicians to perform mental health assessments and transition services for youth under probation supervision, including those detained in or committed to the juvenile hall. Presently, 1.5 FTE positions are allocated to perform mental health assessments on youth referred to them by DPOs under JJCPA. Referrals are generated by DPOs performing court investigations or supervision duties. The information from the assessments helps inform decision making during Intake investigations, disposition social studies (court reports), and case management and service program referrals. These assessments offer a valuable clinical perspective on issues impacting a youth and a youth's family, and will help determine the need for higher interventions such as intensive home based interventions or foster care placement. Assessments are generally comprehensive in nature but may also be an update to a previous comprehensive assessment or a brief assessment that seeks to identify medical necessity and eligibility for Medi-Cal programs. They performed 19 assessments. The clinicians also provide Iliaison and transition services for youth exiting the juvenile hall or LPBC. The clinician will work with peers at community mental health clinics and coordinate care activities for the highest need youth. They assist in establishing services with CBOs who may provide a lower level of mental health care. Clinicians help Probation Department staff problem-solve issues related to mental health services and help staff navigate the sometimes complex system requirements regarding eligibility, Medi-Cal funding, medication management protocols, and continuity of care. They will also provide short-term, targeted interventions for some youth to support a successful transition, including clinical sessions at the juvenile hall that focus on assisting youth as they transition back to their homes. They performed 289 hours of individual and group therapy and completed 247 separate contacts supporting engagement efforts with youth. YOBG funding supports a 0.5 FTE position for this activity. The need for transition services such as these has expanded and the use of clinicians to perform these needed duties will grow accordingly.
