Scope of Position:

Under general direction of the Research Data Manager, the Research Data Specialist II (RDS II) is a member of the Research Unit responsible for independently designing, organizing and conducting the evaluation of criminal and juvenile justice grant and pilot programs, special research projects, and the collection and analysis of data from local community corrections agencies. Evaluation and data collection in support of the Board of State and Community Corrections grant programs are the core focus of this position. This position requires high-level writing and analytical skills, accuracy, and completed staff work including the ability to work independently and meet timelines and deadlines.

This position works in conjunction with Field Representatives for the four (4) BSCC Divisions: Standards and Training for Corrections (STC), Corrections Planning and Grant Programs (CPGP), Facilities Standards and Operations (FSO), and the County Facilities Construction (CFC).

Duties and Responsibilities:

(Candidates must perform the following functions with or without reasonable accommodations.)

- **Evaluation of Programs** – Design, develop, and document methodologies to evaluate program-wide and project-specific outcome results for grant programs, pilot programs, or other projects. Provide technical assistance to local program coordinators regarding local evaluation plans, data collection, evaluation of outcomes, and preliminary and final local evaluation reports. Technical assistance includes preparing training materials, providing training, providing assistance with research design, and providing assistance through the identification, development, and coordination of resources (external or internal), defining necessary data elements, and facilitating opportunities for collaboration. Review, interpret, and analyze data from grantee and program reports (progress, preliminary, and final) and provide interpretation to Field Representatives and/or management. Identify points of comparison between programs and make recommendations for data correlation and/or contrast. Prepare and draft written materials/reports for the BSCC, state legislature, grantees and stakeholders on the program-wide outcomes of grant fund investments. Present data and evaluation-related knowledge, findings, and recommendations to a variety of internal and external stakeholders.

- **Specialized Research and Data Collection Projects** – Design, plan and conduct specialized research projects, complex studies, and data collection projects, including any associated statistical analyses, to address BSCC’s data collection, data reporting, and research mandates and questions posed by various entities (e.g., management, legislative bodies). Prepare and present technical reports and make recommendations to management based on findings and provide expert consultation and technical support to staff on the feasibility, design and impact of research and data collection projects. Design, test, and implement a wide variety of large-scale surveys using scientific survey design and sampling methodology; analyze, document, and present results of analyses of survey data.
- **Other Related Assignments** – Participate in work groups and professional organizations related to criminal and juvenile justice data issues. Research and use state and national data trends to assist in the work of the Research Team and the four BSCC divisions. Analyze and appropriately respond to information requests for data from internal staff and external stakeholders. In lead capacity, develop and conduct informative presentations on a variety of topics (e.g., research studies, projects, program evaluations, and recommendations) at meetings and conferences to technical and non-technical audiences. Design, develop, and maintain data dashboards for a variety of data sets.
