Scope of Position:

Under general direction provided by the Facilities Standards and Operations (FSO) Deputy Director (CEA B), and in collaboration with the Research Data Manager, the Research Specialist III (RS III), is a member of the Research Unit performing a variety of research functions to support the Board of State and Community Corrections' research mission. Research functions include: designing and conducting research projects, conducting studies of moderate to highly complex scope, establish survey methodologies, and direct evaluations of community corrections-related programs.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Program Evaluation: Design and direct the development of complex research studies, including program evaluations, using appropriate research methodology and techniques. Develop program-wide and project-specific evaluation plans and studies, including outcome measures, prepare and provide training and technical assistance. Prepare and present written materials/reports for the BSCC, state legislature, grantees, and stakeholders on the results of research studies, program-wide and project-specific evaluations, including those of grant fund investments.
- Survey Design and Analysis: Design, test, implement, and maintain large-scale surveys, including the development of databases, using advanced research and survey expertise. Conduct statistical analyses and prepare complex reports and summaries of survey data. Provide high-level consultation and technical support on the feasibility, design and impact of research and data collection projects.
- Community Corrections Data: Collect and analyze data related to the community corrections system to address BSCC's data collection, data reporting, and research mandates and questions posed by various entities (e.g., management, legislative bodies). Work with members of the Research Unit to respond to legislative mandates and requests. Develop reports and provide

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technical assistance relative to BSCC programs and community corrections data for management review, and public and stakeholder dissemination.

- Grant Related Duties: Lead the development of the proposal rating procedures
 included in the requests for proposals (RFPs) for large-scale legislativelyfunded grant programs, train raters to ensure the reliability of the ratings;
 develop data systems to conduct complex analytical and statistical analyses of
 the ratings and to timely produce the list of programs recommended for funding
 to the BSCC Board based on the ratings.
- Other Duties as Assigned: Other research related duties as directed or required, such as ad-hoc and or special reports, analysis of data trends and development of issue papers. Analyze and appropriately respond to information requests for data from internal staff and external stakeholders. Develop and conduct informative presentations on a variety of topics (e.g., research studies, projects, program evaluations, and recommendations) at meetings and conferences to technical and non-technical audiences.

Desirable Qualifications:

- Ability to function as lead for complex large scale research projects.
- Knowledge of and experience with advanced automation processes for capturing data.
- Experience designing and implementing research projects using statistical software for capturing data.
